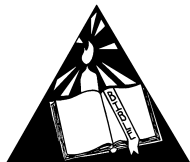

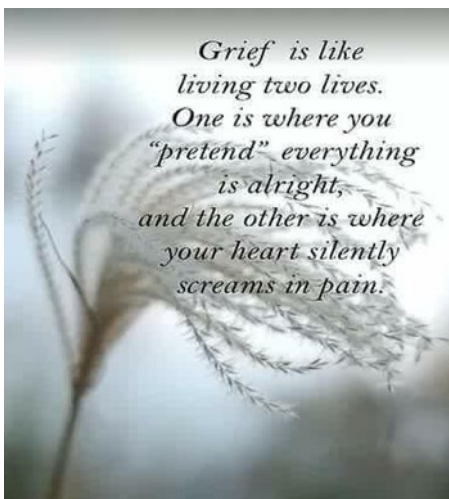
Last year our parish received donations in the amount of \$250 from four donors. If we receive gifts from 10 or

WHOLE COMMUNITY CATECHESIS



On All Souls Day we remember all who have died, especially those from our parish who have died this past year. There are candles burning for the entire month of November in each of our churches to remember these people.

During this time of remembering we are all grieving our loss. Due to the pandemic we didn’t have a special memorial service for these individuals which has in the past helped with our grieving process. When we lose someone dear to us it presents itself in different ways for different people. We must remember that grief is normal. Everyone grieves differently and for different lengths of time and it is important that we respect how each person faces their loss. Grieving can take anywhere from six weeks to four years. It is so important for us to support those who grieve. As a parish, our Helping Hands Ministry Bereavement Team remembers those who have died with a card to the family at the time of death, on All Saints Day, on Christmas, on Easter and on the one year anniversary of the death of their loved one. As a ministry we hope that this helps families in coping with the death of a loved one and to realize that there is no set time for grieving. In our hearts we all know that death is a part of life and it reminds us of how precious life is.

Please offer this prayer for those who are grieving.

Father God, I pray for the families who are grieving the loss of someone they love. Lord heal the hurting. Be with the one that is alone after losing their loved one. Give them the strength to go on. Be with the children that lost a parent, and with the parent that lost a child. Heal the broken, heal the hurting. Touch them with Your healing hand today. May the Holy Spirit speak to their hearts. In the name of Christ Jesus I pray. Amen.

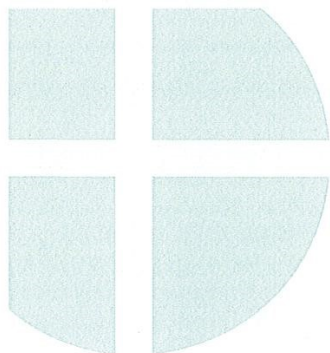

Today is World Day of the Poor

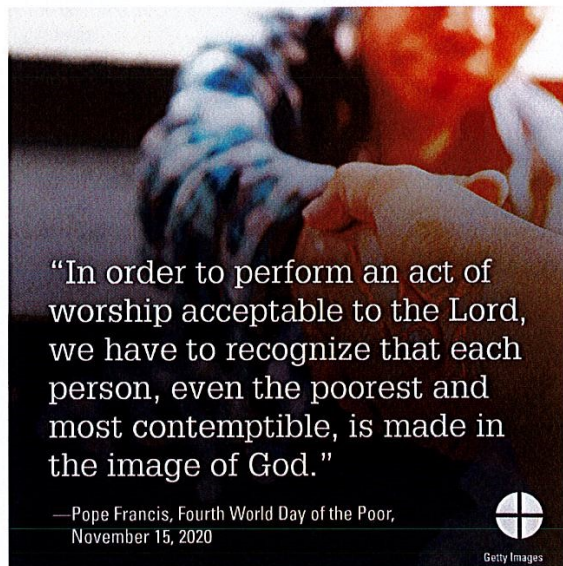

Saint of the Week

Saint Elizabeth of Hungary

Feast Day—November 17

Elizabeth's short life was nonetheless full; she had a happy marriage and children, was a secular Franciscan, and was so devoted to the poor and sick that she gave away royal robes and founded hospitals. The daughter of a Hungarian king, Elizabeth married a nobleman of Thuringia, Louis, at age 14. He complained about the expense of her many charities until he witnessed a miracle involving Elizabeth, bread and roses. After he died during a Crusade, she became a Third Order Franciscan at Marburg, Germany, where she founded a hospital to care for the sick. Elizabeth, who was declared a saint in 1235, is the patron of bakers, young brides, widows, those falsely accused, countesses and secular Franciscans.

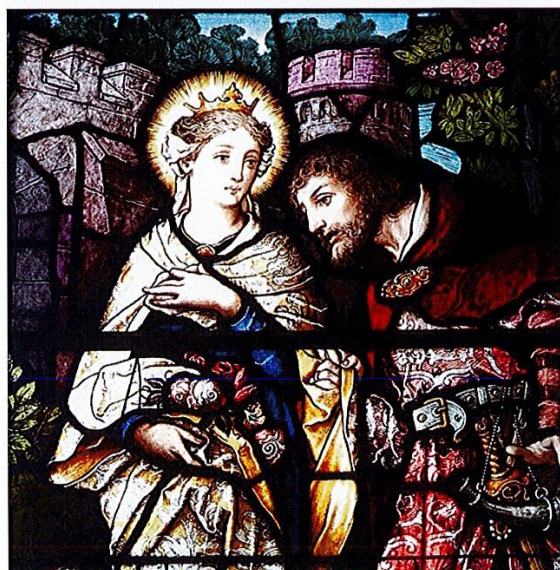

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ:

On the weekend of November 21-22, a second collection will be taken up in our parishes for the Catholic Campaign for Human Development (CCHD).

As you may know, CCHD is the national anti-poverty program of the U.S. Catholic Bishops, working to break the cycle of poverty by helping people with low income participate in decisions that affect their lives, families, and communities.

Half of the funds from this collection remain in the Diocese of Erie to help organizations such as Maria House Project, Erie Dawn, and Inter-Church Ministries fight poverty in our local communities.
