GOING TO MASS AT HOME

At the present time it is physically impossible to attend Mass in our own church but there are many other opportunities available to us. Being quarantined has forced us to follow along on the internet, on Facebook, on EWTN or other television stations, etc.

Of course during this time we may not be as attentive as if we were actually attending in a church, but we should still participate by responding to the parts of the Mass as if we were actually there.

How do we do this? We do it with the devotion that is expected as if we were actually at a live Mass.

- \Rightarrow Try to get your family to attend with you as you watch the Mass because it is easier to concentrate on what is happening.
- ⇒ Choose a time that is suitable to the family so that all may attend together as the Masses are offered at many times throughout the day.
- \Rightarrow Put out a cross and light a candle or two to create the right setting.
- \Rightarrow Get dressed for the occasion and not be in your PJs.
- \Rightarrow Try to go through the motions, like standing when appropriate and kneeling, if able.
- \Rightarrow Remember to respond to the prayers and acclamations because these gestures are full of meaning.
- ⇒ Pray your own prayers of intentions and also for our world for healing throughout this coronavirus. Pray for the health care workers, the government, the Bishops, the Pope and, of course, the Church.
- ⇒ Although you cannot receive Jesus in the Eucharist, make a prayer of spiritual communion. There are many versions available but you can also pray your own spiritual prayer of Communion. (see the insert in last week's bulletin regarding spiritual communion)
