12 SUGGESTIONS FOR FAMILIES **DURING THE PANDEMIC**

- 1. READ THE BIBLE TOGETHER. Read the scripture that is printed in this bulletin for each day. If you would read the scripture every day, in three years you will have read the entire bible.
- 2. PRAY TOGETHER. Pray for those on the prayer chain, the shut-ins or any needs of your family.
- 3. SERVE PEOPLE IN NEED. There are many people who are shut-in or people who have had difficulties with jobs or illnesses, do something nice for them take a meal, offer to help with home or auto repairs they may have, etc.
- 4. ATTEND SUNDAY MASS TOGETHER. During the pandemic, even though Bishop Persico has excused us from attending Mass, we still need to watch Mass as a family from other parishes that offer live-streaming, or attend Mass at your church with social distancing and proper mask wearing. Stay and help with disinfecting afterwards.
- 5. GET INVOLVED WITH THE CHURCH AND/OR COMMUNITY ACTIVITIES:. We are down on offertory contributions and we have tried to come up with other ways of creating income for our parish. One idea we came up with was the Take A Chance Raffle (to replace the Reverse Raffle) which benefits our parish. Thank you to all who supported this effort.
- 6. EAT TOGETHER AS A FAMILY. We may have to limit our holiday get-togethers, but as our family gathers to eat together, we must remember to pray a blessing and thank God for what we have been given. We can always "facetime or zoom" with our extended family members during this time of social distancing.
- 7. CELEBRATE RITUALS AT HOME. Make your own family rituals and share with others what is working for your family.
- 8. PARTICIPATE IN FAMILY CONVERSATIONS. Stay off your phones and talk with each other.
- 9. TALK ABOUT YOUR FAITH AND RELIGION. Each student has been given materials for their faith formation homeschooling. These materials can also be used as family conversation starters.
- 10. RITUALIZE IMPORTANT FAMILY MILESTONES. Celebrate anniversaries, baptisms, birthdays, yearly anniversaries, graduations, engagements, etc.
- 11. CELEBRATE THE HOLIDAYS AND CHURCH SEASONS. Create new ways to celebrate during the pandemic and share your ideas with other families.
- 12. DISCUSS MORAL ISSUES. There are many immoral activities happening in our country. We need to follow the teachings of our Catholic Faith and discuss what is right and what we are seeing that is not moral teaching.
