WHOLE COMMUNITY CATECHESIS

Please join us for Mass next Sunday as we celebrate Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord. Mass will begin in the social hall.

PALM SUNDAY COMMEMORATION

The opening of the Palm Sunday Mass is a vivid expression of public worship. Catholic Churches offer a procession to begin the liturgy, and the faithful are invited to take an active part.

This opening is called "The Commemoration of the Lord's Entrance into Jerusalem." The word *commemoration* implies more than a historical lesson. People are to do more than remember. They are to partake in the entry of the Lord.

The commemoration takes one of three different forms. The first is the procession, which begins outside the place where the Mass will be celebrated and moves toward the church. The second form takes place inside the church when an outdoor procession is not possible. Both these forms include the blessing of palm branches and the proclamation of the Gospel of Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem. One of these two forms must be used at every parish church. If the first form is used at one Mass, it should not be repeated at other Masses. The second form, however, may be done as often as the parish wishes.

The third form is a simplified beginning that does not include the blessing of branches nor the proclamation of the Gospel of Palm Sunday. Mass begins in the usual way, and the entrance antiphon for the day is the only mention of the triumphal entry into Jerusalem. It is designed for Masses when insufficient number of ministers or a lack of time demands a simpler, shorter service. As long as one Mass includes the first or second form of the commemoration, others may observe the third. However, most Catholics take a strong interest in participating in a procession, which creates a bond among themselves and their Lord and Christ, who enters as king of their hearts.

PLEASE NOTE that all services for Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Easter Vigil will be held at Our Lady of Lourdes. With all the steps of the heating oil cleanup project at the rectory now completed, we'd like to offer you an overview of the project. In 2018, we discovered that water was getting into the fuel oil tank located underground at the rectory, but the reason for the water problem wasn't clear at that time. A new above ground tank was installed and there were no further problems with the heating system. Last summer we started to notice the smell of fuel inside the rectory basement. All of the lines were checked but the origin of the odor was not discovered. Eventually, the odor became stronger and with more investigation the source was finally discovered. Fuel oil was seeping into and through the foundation blocks of the rectory and was gathering in the ditch and sump pump area of the basement, in the vicinity of where the older underground fuel tank was located. After consultation with our fuel delivery company and officials at our insurance company, we were instructed that nothing could be done before receiving direction from the PA Department of Environmental Resources. After the PA DEP officials investigated the situation and checked the ground in the vicinity of where the sump pump had dispersed the fuel, we were told that there would not be any monetary fines issued as long as the problem was properly taken care of. In cooperation with the PA DEP representatives, we retained the services of ACV Enviro, the only company in the area qualified to do this kind of work, to handle the clean-up of the situation. We believe that as a church we not only had a legal but also moral obligation to properly take care of the environment that has been given to us by God. The work completed by ACV included vacuuming out the fuel/ water mixture from the underground tank, the removal and disposal of the tank, and removal of the contaminated soil from the surrounding area (in compliance with the PA DEP); all of which was taken away to an approved disposal site. The staff at the local PA DEP office informed us of a grant program so that we could recoup some of our costs. Once the work was completed, the proper paperwork was filed and we did receive a \$4,000 grant (the maximum amount available). The total cost of the project was \$19,287.91, minus the \$4,000 grant = \$15,287.91. This cost was much higher than originally estimated because, the problem being underground, there was no way to know how extensive the work would be until the removal process began. Unfortunately, our insurance did not cover any of this expense. We were able to pay for this project by using funds that the parish had in our reserve accounts.

As our diocesan family prepares to celebrate the Paschal Mystery, I encourage you to participate in the events of Holy Week. Know that you are in my prayer. Please know also of my gratitude for your generous response on behalf of the Christians of the Holy Land. May the Lord bless you abundantly this Holy Week, this Easter, and beyond.
