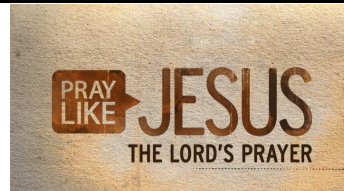

**CHILD PROTECTION AND CREATING SAFE ENVIRONMENTS—Know the Warning Signs of Abuse:** Those who abuse children look like everyone else. They don't look like scary people that we should know to avoid. Rather, they live with their families in our neighborhoods. One of the most important ways to ensure the safety of children in our environments is to know the warning signs of adults who present a risk of harm to children. Among these signs are when the person (1) always wants to be alone with children in areas where no one can monitor their interactions, (2) allows children to do things their parents would not permit, (3) is always more excited to be with children than adults, and (4) discourages others from participating in activities involving kids. **Here is some trivia about our parish and the Annual Frenchtown Ham or Chicken Dinner:**

**1833** – The parish was founded by Jean-Nicholas DeMaison and Jean-Claude Doubet. (Look for their graves in the parish cemetery).

**1834** – Bishop Kendrick from Philadelphia first visits Frenchtown. He gave \$50.00 towards the construction of the first church.

**1838** – On August 15, 1838 Bishop Kendrick blessed the first church. This log (?) structure stood on land now occupied by the cemetery. The church was named after the French ancestral village of the DeMaison and Doubet families, Sainte Hippolyte.

**1841** – A large hand-carved primitive crucifix was presented to the church by its creator, J.C. Faiver. (This crucifix now hangs in the reconciliation room of Saint Hippolyte.)

**1845** – The first resident pastor, Rev. Marc-Antoine de la Roque, is named by the Bishop of Pittsburgh.

**1866** – Rev. Eugene Cogneville was named pastor of Saint Hippolyte by the Bishop of Erie. It was during this venerable priest's fifty year tenure that the present church was constructed. (You can visit his grave in the parish cemetery.)

**1888** – The first fund raising dinner was held at Saint Hippolyte. On the menu was chicken fricassee. Games, bingo and square dancing to the music of local fiddlers added to the festivities.

**1914-1917** – The dinners were interrupted by the First World War. World War II also caused the cancellation of the "Frenchtown Picnic" during the 1940s.

**1956** – The menu changes to fried chicken, prepared at the homes of parishioners and brought to the church.

**1970** – The dinner was changed to ham for six years due to Department of Health regulations.

**1977** – Under the direction of Rev. Richard Mayer, barbecue pits were built and the menu changed for the final time: ½ Bar-B-Q Chicken or a generous portion of Ham, mashed potatoes, gravy, vegetable, applesauce, coleslaw, rolls and homemade pies.

**2018** – Over 300 workers from Saint Hippolyte and Our Lady of Lourdes prepared and served: 1350 chicken halves (using 600 pounds of charcoal), 175 pounds of ham, 150 dozen rolls, 235 pies, 100 gallons of green beans, 70 gallons of applesauce, 200 pounds of coleslaw, 600 pounds of potatoes, 32 gallons of gravy, 360 gallons of pink lemonade, 360 gallons of iced tea and 1200 cups of coffee.




**1564 dinners were served.**
