Each Wednesday during Lent we celebrate the Stations of the Cross, alternating between St. Hippolyte and Our Lady of Lourdes. The Stations follow our Soup and Bread meals, which are a **service** to one another.

Coming together is forming us into a **community** of believers. This is a time of **worship** together as well as a 14-step journey that commemorates Jesus Christ's last day on earth as a human. At each Station we meditate on the event that is mentioned. The Stations are used to allow us to move from one event to the next, meditating on each one as they are outlined for us and this gives us the **message** of the Lenten season.

- 1. Jesus is condemned to death
- 2. Jesus carries His cross
- 3. Jesus falls the first time
- 4. Jesus meets His mother
- 5. Simon of Cyrene helps Jesus carry His cross
- 6. Veronica wipes the face of Jesus
- 7. Jesus falls the second time
- 8. Jesus meets the women of Jerusalem
- 9. Jesus falls the third time
- 10. Jesus' clothes are taken away
- 11. Jesus is nailed to the cross
- 12. Jesus dies on the cross
- 13. The body of Jesus is taken down from the cross
- 14. Jesus is laid in the tomb
