Our 14th Reverse Raffle, sponsored by Le Nom du Pere Society, is less than 3 weeks away! The date for this year is Saturday, November 6. Le Nom du Pere Society does not keep any of the profit, but rather does the planning and organizing.

#### What is a Reverse Raffle?

In addition to the main board worth \$1,000 we will be selling "side-board" tickets for \$2.00, \$3.00 and \$5.00 per ticket with chances to win \$150, \$225 and \$375 on those boards. Tickets for the side-boards will go on sale at 6:00pm that evening. You will also have the opportunity to purchase tickets to win other great prizes as well as playing bingo (winner splits the pot with the house) and a huge 50/50. Those great prizes that will be given away on November 6 are: a Ruger model 1149 22 Long Rifle, a Centerpoint AMPED 425 compound crossbow, a 36" Griddle with accessories, and a Date Night Package. 
