Our 14th Reverse Raffle, sponsored by Le Nom du Pere Society, is less than 3 weeks away! The date for this year is Saturday, November 6. This one-day event usually raises over \$9,000 which is turned over —100%— to the parish general fund to help with ongoing expenses. Le Nom du Pere Society does not keep any of the profit, but rather does the planning and organizing.

What is a Reverse Raffle?

When you buy a ticket for a “reverse” raffle, you will be hoping that your number is pulled from the ticket drum LAST! The last number to be pulled will be the big winner. We sell only 150 tickets. A \$45.00 ticket will provide you with a lovely dinner for two and a chance at the \$1,000 grand prize! If your ticket is pulled early in the raffle you will win a smaller prize (which is why we are asking families to donate “loser” prizes), but your fun is certainly not over at that point. In addition to the main board worth \$1,000 we will be selling “side-board” tickets for \$2.00, \$3.00 and \$5.00 per ticket with chances to win \$150, \$225 and \$375 on those boards. Tickets for the side-boards will go on sale at 6:00pm that evening. You will also have the opportunity to purchase tickets to win other great prizes as well as playing bingo (winner splits the pot with the house) and a huge 50/50. Those great prizes that will be given away on November 6 are: a Ruger model 1149 22 Long Rifle, a Centerpoint AMPED 425 compound crossbow, a 36” Griddle with accessories, and a Date Night Package. So buy your ticket, get your date, and arrive at 5:30pm when the fun begins. Since this is a gambling event, guests must be at least 18 years of age to attend. Beer will be provided for those over age 21, but feel free to bring your own favorite beverages. Soda and water are also provided. **This is a great Christian Community building activity** as well as a wonderful (and greatly needed) fundraiser for our parish.

Once again we are asking for the help of every parish family.
