**REMINDER...Good Friday is a day of fasting** for those ages 18-59. This means eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids including milk and fruit juice are allowed. Those bound by this law may take one full meal. Two smaller meals, sufficient to maintain strength according to one's needs, are also permitted. Good Friday is also a day of abstinence from eating meat for those 14 years of age and older.

**CHILD ABUSE AND CREATING SAFE ENVIRONMENTS — Child Abuse Prevention Month: Be Vigilant.** It is vitally important that we are constantly vigilant concerning the behaviors of those who interact with children. And we must always communicate our concerns to the appropriate parties. Sometimes this means communicating our safety concerns to our children. And sometimes this means communicating our concerns about seemingly inappropriate behavior to those who are in a position to intervene. Parents must also listen carefully to their children and observe both their children's activities and the behavior of older children and adults who interact with them. When children exhibit dramatic behavioral changes, adults must find out what caused the changes. Being aware of what's happening with our children means talking to, listening to, and observing them—at every opportunity. Palm Sunday is the day we celebrate the triumphal entry of Jesus into Jerusalem, one week before His resurrection. Also called Passion Sunday, today is the first day of Holy Week and the Sunday before Easter Sunday. Palm Sunday marks Jesus' entrance into Jerusalem and the path was lined with palm branches before His arrest on Holy Thursday and His crucifixion on Good Friday.
