LIFE TEEN

Last spring Bishop Persico and the Presbyteral Council approved the eventual movement of Confirmation to the 9th grade. The key points or reasons were:

- What we are doing is not working.
- The new approach integrates proven strategies.
- The proposal incorporates flexibility so that parishes can work at their own pace, taking up to six years to complete the transition.
- The rollout plan includes both training and accompaniment for parish leaders and volunteers.

We have chosen to work with the Epiphany of the Lord Parish Faith Formation in Meadville because we have the same pastor, Fr. Jeff Lucas. We are following the 4-year plan and Joyce Tarr completed the diocesan training in order to start in the fall of 2022 with **Edge** in 6-8th grades; 9th grade will complete the **Chosen** program and the 10th and 11th grades use **Purpose** from the Life Teen program. In 2023, we are confirming our 10th and 11th grade students on May 23. In 2024, we will be confirming our students in 9th and 10th grades and in the following years we will confirm our 9th grade students. Following Confirmation, we will be forming small group sharing for 10th, 11th, and 12th grade students, for which we will need adult volunteers. Please open your hearts and consider leading one of these groups.

This new program also provides for parent sessions with a different topic each month. Last month the topic was *Social Media and Identity: Raising Digital Natives*. Today, November 13th, we are offering all parents and catechists a session on *How do I pray with my children? Teaching my children to hear God's voice*. Upcoming dates and topics include:

- ◆ December 18—Decision making and discernment: Do these choices help me be the best version of myself?
- ◆ January 15—Where do I go? Answering questions about God and Faith.
- February 12—*Disillusionment with the Church*.
- ◆ March 12—What is my identity: Discovering who I am.
- ◆ April 16—How God sees you: Identity in Christ.
- May 7—Sexuality and continuing conversations.

These parent sessions are held in the social hall following the Sunday Mass at St. Hippolyte. The reason this time was chosen is to make it available for all parents, grandparents, catechists, or any adult who may be interested. Lunch is provided. Please call Joyce Tarr (814-671-1009) if you are interested in helping in any way or for more information.

The General Introduction for the *Pastoral Care of the Sick* discusses the recipient of Anointing of the Sick.

RECIPIENTS OF THE ANOINTING OF THE SICK

8. The Letter of James states that the sick are to be anointed in order to raise them up and save them (Jas 5:14-15).

Great care and concern should be taken to see that those of the faithful whose health is <u>seriously impaired by sickness or old age</u> receive this sacrament.

A prudent or reasonably sure judgment, without scruple, is sufficient for deciding on the seriousness of an illness; if necessary a doctor may be consulted.

- 9. The sacrament may be repeated if the sick person recovers after being anointed and then again falls ill or if during the same illness the person's condition becomes more serious.
- 10. A sick person may be anointed before surgery whenever a serious illness is the reason for the surgery.
- 11. Elderly people may be anointed <u>if they have become notably weakened even though no serious illness is present</u>.
- 12. Sick children may be anointed if they have sufficient use of reason to be strengthened by this sacrament.
- 13. In public and private catechesis, the faithful should be educated to ask for the sacrament of anointing and, as soon as the right time comes, to receive it with full faith and devotion. They should not follow the wrongful practice of delaying the reception of the sacrament. All who care for the sick should be taught the meaning and purpose of the sacrament.
- 14. The sacrament of anointing is to be conferred on sick people who, although they have lost consciousness or the use of reason, have, as Christian believers, at least implicitly asked for it when they were in control of their faculties.
- 15. When a priest has been called to attend those who are already dead, he should not administer the sacrament of anointing. Instead, he should pray for them, asking that God forgive their sins and graciously receive them into the kingdom.

The anointing of the sick is not to be conferred on anyone who remains obdurately in open and serious sin.

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ:
