LIVING OUR FAITH

"They devoted themselves to the teaching of the apostles and to the communal life, to the breaking of the bread and to the prayers."

Acts 2:42

The Apostles represented all of God's people, a fulfillment of the twelve tribes of Israel. We, the members of the Body of Christ, like the early believers are committed to follow the Apostles, the Pope and the Bishops. In this unity, we experience Christ in prayer and in the breaking of the bread. When we practice the precepts of the Church it helps us to lead a moral life and remain united with the church.

The ideal Christian community is open to the Holy Spirit. They have in the past shared everything in common, including prayer, meals, and possession. No one then went in need. - Spiritual Works of Mercy, acts of compassion in which we help our neighbors with their emotional and spiritual needs: instruct, advise, console, comfort, forgive, bear wrongs patiently.
