on the carpet where we pray: "Holy Spirit, you are invited here. Holy Spirit, you are expected here. Holy Spirit, you are welcome here. Holy Spirit, I love you." I then set a timer for 3 minutes and we close our eyes and are silent.

Asking the Kindergarteners WHY we are going to the desert this Lent, they will tell you: "Because Jesus went into the desert for 40 days and fasted. He went to listen to His Father. He went to be filled up with the Holy Spirit. He did this to get ready to tell people about the Kingdom of God." We go to our desert spot to listen to the voice of the Father with Jesus and to be filled up with the Holy Spirit!

"But, Miss Zgonc," they say, "we don't hear anything." It's then that I get to tell them that just as a doctor puts us to sleep to perform surgery on people who are sick, and they don't know or realize what is happening to them, so too does God do very powerful work in us when we are still and quiet. The most beautiful things grow in silence.

I encourage you to make time the rest of this Lent to go quietly into the desert with Jesus to listen to the voice of the Father and be filled with the Holy Spirit yourself. God has great and awesome work for you to do and longs to prepare you for that mission!
