September 29 is the feast of our parish and school's patron saint: St. Michael! St. Michael has been and continues to be one of the Church's most POWERFUL intercessors. We are so blessed to have him as our patron! If you'd like to learn about him, look in Scripture! He's found in Daniel 10, Daniel 12, Jude, and Revelation 12.



There is also a powerful prayer that St. Leo XIII wrote in 1866 and encouraged the Church to pray, especially after each Mass. Read the backstory here.

St. Michael has been interceding for SMS in a BIG way this year! We...

- increased our enrollment by 13 new students (keep you prayers coming for more!),
- beautified the gym, lunchroom, Lateran Hall entryway, and 3 classroom floors with the help of the Ribley family and friends, Packard Paint, Dave Slack, an anonymous donor, and many parish and school volunteers.
- cleaned and readied the school thanks to the grunt work from Fr. Brandon, Dcn. Marty, seminarian Brandon, Brian and Chris Durniok, and MANY parish and school volunteers,
- opened a <u>second</u> PreK4 class: the first double class per grade in over a decade,
- welcomed 3 new teachers and an additional PreK Aide,

- introduced our Irish Ideals of <u>Saintly</u>, <u>Mindful</u>, and <u>Safe to our students with lessons all around our campus to teach them our Irish Ideal expectations in each section,</u>

- sorted" our students into Saint Houses (think Harry Potter Hogwarts houses, but named after Saints!) with St. Gemma Galgani, Bl. Pier Giorgio Frassati, Bl. Chiara Luce Badano, and Bl. Carlo Acutis as patrons,
- those patrons saints for all our classes,
- had our first Clubs: Jump Rope, Crochet, and Chess/Checkers,
- learned all about how to be "Safe at Lunch" with a puppet show put on by Midwestern Intermediate Unit
- raised money for the Pink Angels (\$200.02!!!), our first Casual for a Cause this year,
- held a successful Shamrock (Golf) Scramble thanks to our Marketing/Fundraising Coordinator, Trichelle Eddy, and many parent and parishioner volunteers,
- administered the NWEA Map Growth and Fluency assessments to our Kindergarten 7th Grade students,
- ventured to the Waugh House to learn about and interact with Greenville history,
- 👼 and, of course, began the wondrous adventure of learning in all our subjects this year! 😊

First Friday Eucharistic Adoration

Every **First Friday** of the month, St. Michael parish offers Eucharistic Adoration. As Catholics, we take Jesus at His word when He says, "This is my Body." "This is my Blood." (Luke 22:19-20; Matthew 26:26-28; Mark 14:22-24; 1 Corinthians 11:23-25) After Mass on these First Fridays, Fr. Brandon will place Jesus, in a consecrated host, in a monstrance (Latin for "to show"). The faithful are then invited to pray in front of and with Jesus throughout the day. Students love visiting Jesus in the Eucharist on these days. Each age group has an opportunity to talk to Him, voice personal intentions, be silent, sing, and meditate on Scripture. We also have the tradition of celebrating these days with doughnuts or cookies! ©

SMS students can look forward to a Fall Break from **October 7** to **October 11**. Classes will resume on Thursday, **October 12**. October 9 is Columbus/Indigenous People Day, October 10 is an SMS Teacher Inservice Day, and October 11 is a mandated diocesan Teacher Professional Development Day – this day counts as the students' 180 days of school, even though it is just the teachers attending. It is called an Exception to 180 Days.

Parents have the option to order copies of their child's portrait through Lifetouch's website OR through the paper order form which was sent home the last week of September.
