#### **Ash Wednesday/Lent**

Wednesday, <u>February 22</u>, is Ash Wednesday and the first day of Lent. Even though Ash Wednesday is NOT a Holy Day of Obligation, our school has a tradition of attending the 9:00am Mass on this day.

Because it is the first day of Lent, it is a day of fasting (no eating in between meals) and abstinence (not eating meat). Therefore, instead of the Pepperoni Lunch being on Wednesday, it will be on Thursday, <u>February 23</u>.

Fun Facts: The only other day in Lent that is a day of both fasting and abstinence is Good Friday. All Fridays in Lent are days of abstinence from meat. The Church actually encourages us to abstain from meat every Friday of the year.

## **Reminders:**

- As per our dress code, all students in Grades K-8 need to have their shirts tucked in. Belts are required for students in Grades 4-8 when wearing pants or shorts with belt loops.
- Toys should not be sent/brought into school. The exception will be by special permission/request from the teacher (i.e. a show-n-tell project).
