Dear SMS Families,

May, the month of Mother's Day, Spring showing up in full bloom, is also the month of Mary, our Blessed Mother, Mama Mary. During this month, we crown a statue of Mary, create little May altars in our school and homes, plant Mary gardens, and pray the Rosary more fervently. It is a time to consecrate ourselves anew to Jesus through His Mother Mary.



The painting shown above has always been a favorite of mine. Most, once including me, assume that it is a painting of Mary holding Baby Jesus, and looking at it through those eyes is very powerful. What blew me away however was the story I was told behind the painting. As I was told, this *Madonna of the Streets* by by Italian artist Roberto Ferruzzi, is actually meant to represent a young and desparate mother with her baby wandering the streets in search of shelter. When she is about to give up hope, she rounds a corner and comes face to face with the Blessed Mother, holding Jesus. The Blessed Mother quietly holds out her hands to receive the young mother's baby and places her own Son, Jesus in the mother's arms, signifying that she, Mary, will take care of young mother's baby. What we see in the painting is the young mother holding *Jesus* and looking at Mary holding her own child, knowing that they are both safe and will be taken care of!

I invite you to pray with me and this image during the month of May. Place your child in the arms of Our Mother and hold Jesus close to your heart!




SMS ACTIVITY CLUBS, A TRIBUTE TO OUR TEACHERS!



Thank you to Mr. Doug Dorio and Mrs. Erica Dorio for bringing SMS Activity Clubs to our school! Last year, these 2 teachers talked about wanting to form a Pet Club in honor of St. Francis of Assisi, the patron saint of animals. The idea was brought to fruition this year with the formation of just such a club: the St. Francis "Animal Advocacy" Club.

All of our teachers jumped on board and created several other Clubs that our students could choose from to join, among them: the Kindness Club, School Newspaper Club, Drama Club, Boardgame Club, and Pep Club. Each Club contributed something unique to our school community:

Most recently on May 8, the St. Francis "Animal Advocacy" Club invited Marcy Webb-Jaynes from Therapy Dogs United to lead an assembly! Marcy brought her 2 dogs, Jessie and Genevieve, both Aussiedoodles, to our school to teach our students all about Therapy Dogs! The St. Francis "Animal Advocacy" Club also led a Lenten drive to collect items that animals at Strayhaven Animal Shelter in Greenville needed. The items filled the Dorio's car to overflowing! In addition to this collection, the Club hosted an extra Casual for a Cause Day with proceeds going to Strayhaven. It was our biggest collection for a Cause this year at over \$200!



- Mrs. Endicott and Mrs. Maloney teamed up with the Kindness Club to spread kindness and beauty throughout the school and community with Candygrams for the whole school, cards that were sent to St. Paul's residents, and signs for Veterans displayed at our Veterans' Day program! In addition to these acts of love, the Kindness Club also created a Kindness book that has been sent away to be published! A copy will forever be available in our school library! Order forms also went out for our students to purchase for themselves!
- The School Newspaper Club worked under the guidance of Mr. Neral to create the *Irish Bugle*, a newspaper featuring an introduction of a new SMS student, stories covering Catholic Schools Week and the Side-by-Side Raffle, and cartoons, as well as a full length feature interview with Fr. Brandon!

Thank you to Mr. Dorio for kickstarting and organizing the schedule for our Clubs!

Each of our teachers goes ABOVE and BEYOND what their public school counterparts are asked or volunteer to do! Behind the scenes, you'll find our teachers voluntarily cleaning the lunchroom, bathrooms, and other parts of the school, taking the trash out, sitting in on team meetings, organizing SAFE, offering to help and assist with morning arrival and afternoon dismissal, asking if they can organize field trips, assemblies, after school programs, and events, planning week-long special activities (i.e. Catholic Schools Week, Read Across America Week), staying after school to set up for events, creating memorable hands-on activities for Family Nights (Math Fluency, Literacy, Science Fair, Fine and Performing Arts, etc), and SO much more!

I'd like to add a special thank you too to our Lead Teacher, Mrs. Maloney, for steering the ship when I can't be, for taking initiative to lead planning meetings for important upcoming events like the Science Fair Open House and the Mother's Day Tea, for being our Curriculum Lead for our Mathematics Professional Learning Team (PLT) and the extra training that goes with it, and for brainstorming after school with me to dream of, plan, and execute ideas to make SMS the best school around!
