Lamb of God, who takes away the sins of the world, have mercy on us.


Pray for us, O holy Mother of God. That we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ.

Looking back on March and April. This past month, we...

- celebrated Literacy Week with Reading Under the Clouds when students were able to read outside with their favorite hat or hair accessory, Team Up with a Good Book when students were able to wear a favorite sports team jersey and participate in a Socratic seminar, Go Crazy for Reading when students were able to wear silly socks or have crazy hair and create their own bookmark, Cozy Up with a Good Book when students were able to have a free dress down day and read with a buddy class, and Reading Makes Us Bright when students read in the dark with flashlights and were allowed to bring in a stuffy,
- danced the Irish jig and to more contemporary music at our annual St. Patrick's Day Glow Dance,
- raised money for the Reynolds VFW that recently burned down in our March Casual for a Cause,
- celebrated Pi Day,
- raised money while earning prizes for the Kids Heart Challenge sponsored by the American Heart Association,
- celebrated St. Patrick's and St. Joseph's Days,
- \clubsuit visited St. Peter's cathedral in Erie for the Chrism Mass on the Monday of Holy Week (7^{th} and 8^{th} Grade).
- prayed along with a presentation of Shadow Stations, performed by the 4th-8th Graders,
- learned the true meaning of Holy Week and Easter,
- enjoyed our Easter Break,
- met for a day to discuss student data, and Math: warm-ups, games, focused free-time, and an ideal Math lesson (teachers),
- hiked cemetery hill with the Frassati House boys to pray a giant living Rosary at the Marian grotto for Bl. Pier Giorgio's "feastday" (his actual feastday is July 4, so we celebrated around the time of his birthday),
- delighted in the wonder and awe of the 2024 Solar Eclipse (hence many classes studied the solar system!).
- celebrated the feast of St. Gemma Galgani by gathering for a special lunch complete with pizzelles (Galgani House Girls),
- enjoyed 2 scrumptious hot lunches prepared by fantastic volunteer parents,
- prayed for seminarian, now Deacon Brandon Feikles, as he was ordained to the transitional diaconate,
- discussed the exciting things 7th Graders will be able to do in 8th Grade at Padrone's (Deacon Marty, 7th Grade parents, and Miss Zgonc),
- honored Mrs. Hoovler for Secretary's Day,
- raised money for the Knights of Columbus during our April Casual for a Cause,
- celebrated our students following our Irish Ideals with a special, extra-long recess with bubbles, chalk, a kite, and popsicles,
- * said goodbye to our last remaining 7th and 8th Grade tadpole,
- planned a restoration project for the Frs. Kearns' graves,
- gave tours to many new prospective SMS students and families,
- applied for the 2024-2025 school year with a \$10 a day tuition,
- and, of course, continued the wondrous adventure of learning in all our subjects this year!





Here's the latest peek into our classrooms:

- PreK3 with Mrs. Forsythe learned about the planets in our solar system. Each child created their own planet! They are now learning about flowers and plants and what they need to grow. Each child planted marigold seeds to take care of and will soon be taking them home. They have also been working on their fine motor skills by practicing writing, cutting, and using Play-Doh to make their own creations!
- PreK4 with Mrs. Dorio and Mr. Neral have been working on word problems, patterns, and skip counting in Math, blending sounds and initial consonant sounds in ELA, and learning about the solar system in Science! They also did a Science experiment with shaving cream and food coloring to learn about the water cycle, a unit on bugs, and another on volcanoes, in which they made their own! In Religion, they have been learning about the story of Creation!
- Kindergarteners with Mrs. Toy have been practicing their sight words as well as identifying setting, characters, and main points in a story. In History, they have been learning about the daily life of the people of Ancient Egypt and ways in which it is the same and different from our own lives. In Nature Studies, they have been learning about our solar system. They talked about Earth Day and the ways we can keep our planet healthy and happy! In Math, they are learning about addition and subtraction and how to write equations! With Miss Zgonc in Religion, they have been reading books about Creation and discussing how GOOD God made us and the world!
- 1st Graders with Mrs. Maloney have been able to read some fantastic literature that included Blaze and the Forest Fire, Keep the Lights Burning Abbie, Stone Soup, and The Little House. These are not stories they are listening to but reading themselves! After learning about the first Olympics in History, they studied the difference between Sparta and Athens as well as how they worked together to defeat the Persians. They've also learned about famous ancient philosophers and scientists from Greece such as Plato, Aristotle, Socrates, and Archimedes (who created a device that showed the position of the sun, moon, and planets that could be used to predict eclipses!). In Nature Studies, they started learning about the plant life cycle and parts of the plant. They even planted their own lima bean plants to study and take care of. Finally, they are finishing off the year in Math with measurement, time, and money!
- 2nd Graders with Miss Zuschlag have been enjoying Little House in the Big Woods by Laura Ingalls Wilder. They have also enjoyed learning about the solar system. In Religion with Deacon Marty, they are learning about the different types of miracles: miracles of supply, miracles of healing, miracles of nature, and miracles of the supernatural!
- 3rd Graders with Mrs. Endicott finished the book Paddington, complete with tasting marmalade: the main character, Paddington's, favorite! In Math, they started learning fractions. In History, they have been studying Marco Polo, and in Religion, they learned about the Rosary while making lapbooks!

- 4th Graders with Mrs. Knicely have been enjoying collections of the best-known and loved fairytales, drawn from the folklore around the world in Literature. In History, they have been studying the Catholic Church's Counter-Reformation response to the Protestant Reformation and the pivotal figures such as St. Ignatius of Loyola, St. Charles Borromeo, and St. Pius V!
- 7th and 8th Graders with Deacon Marty are still reading David Copperfield by Charles Dickens. In Science, they are designing cars that are propelled by rubber bands. In History, they are beginning to study the American Civil War. In Math with Miss Zgonc, they are preparing for the Math Madness Competition at IU4, to compete with students across the 3 counties the IU serves in addition to their regular course work of solving 2-step algebraic equations and ratios. This week, as a service project, they are working to clean and paint the urn on the graves of Fr. John Kearns and Fr. James Kearns, the founders of our school. In Religion with Fr. Brandon, they have been learning a number of classical philosophical proofs for the existence of God - proofs that will help them fortify their faith and show there is a basis for what is spoken in the Scriptures!
- Music classes with Mrs. Giffone worked on patriotic songs, musical form, and imaginative movement to music. Gym classes were introduced to volleyball (we got out the net!) and striking activities. Choir students also began to prepare for the Fine and Performing Arts Night!
- Art classes with Mrs. Cawley have been very busy in the Art Room! Kindergarteners worked on directed drawings reviewing letters I - Island and Insect, J - Jellybeans, K - Kite, L - Lion, M - Monkey, N - Nest, and O - Octopus! 1st Graders folded a paper amusement park with pom-pom pals, folded paper fans with painted plum trees and Spring blossoms, and figured out facial proportions! 2nd Graders worked on a Henri Rousseau jungle scene and imagined constellations! 3rd Graders worked on Amazing Monks Medieval History Illuminated Manuscripts, Leo Lionni fish collages, and dandelion directed drawings! 4th Graders worked on foreshortened figures, drew Pysanky designs on paper eggs, and drew angels from references and their own imaginations to supplement learning about the Catholic Counter Reformation in History to foster imagination through faith! 7th and 8th Graders worked on a surrealist collage and one-point aerial perspective of a city with falling objects!

Math Madness Competition

4th-8th Graders will be traveling to the Midwestern Intermediate Unit 4 building on Friday, **May 3**, to compete in the tri-county Math Madness Competition! Students have been working hard on their addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division skills to prepare. Also called Math 24 or Challenge 24, the game asks players to use 4 numbers 1 time each to get to the number *24*. The fastest one wins! Students will be competing with single digit, double digit, and variable cards – in which they have to not only make it to 24, but also figure out the 4th missing number to get there!

Chocolate Banana Popsicles

Ingredients List:

4 Bananas
3/4 Cup almond (or other nut
butter)
1/2 cup unsweetened almond milk
2tbsp. Cocoa powder
1tbsp. Maple syrup
1/2 Teaspoon vanilla extract

Directions:

- Place all ingredients in a blender and puree until very smooth and creamy. Taste and adjust sweetness as needed.
- Pour the batter into 8-10 popsicle molds and freeze for at least 6 hours until solid.
- Enjoy! Store in a sealed container in the freezer until ready to serve.
