Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence.

Fasting: the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. **Abstinence**: the norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members from age 14 onwards.

Hello Parents,

Just checking in to share what we have been doing the first half of the year. With the teachers' cooperation, I have enjoyed meeting with the students in their classrooms for school counseling activities. My goal, as the school counselor, is to provide activities which develop and/or improve academic skills, career awareness and social skills. The topics discussed are consistent with the Pennsylvania School Counseling Association and American School Counseling Association mindsets and behaviors. Take a look at what was completed in each grade.

During my visits in the kindergarten, first and second grade classes, we focused on listening skills, using self-control, identifying and expressing feelings in a safe way and assuming responsibility for our choices. The students practiced using these skills by completing listening activities, listening to and discussing stories, participating in Go Noodle brain breaks, calming and focusing activities.

The third and fourth grade focused on ways to be successful in school, self-control, and decision making. The third grade was introduced to L.O.G.: Listening Skills, Organization and Goals. The students reviewed and practiced listening skills and concentration skills. They also identified ways they could be more organized with their school materials and time management and each wrote a goal to accomplish this year. Fourth grade students reviewed study skills and assuming responsibility for their own behaviors and decisions. These topics were practiced in teamwork activities, stories, and discussion.

For the fifth grade visits, we reviewed study skills by having the students work in groups to present a skit teaching the study skill. The students also reviewed problem solving and decision making steps and will practice using them in our activities throughout the year.

The sixth grade classes began the year by completing a learning styles inventory. This self- assessment can be found at the following website <u>how-to-study.com</u>. This website provides them with information on their learning preference based on their personal responses. The website also provides tips they can incorporate into their study routine. The topic of communication was addressed through discussion, class activities, and working together in small groups.

The seventh and eighth grade participated in activities identifying personal values and beliefs, cyber safety and decision making. The students completed an online personality inventory which related personality traits to careers.

I will continue to visit the classes during the second semester. As a reminder, I am available to meet with students on an individual basis when parent permission has been given and when requested by the parent, teacher or student. I have materials on many different topics that can address individual needs and are available to teachers and parents if needed.
