Dear SMS Families,

Next week is LENT already! We will be going to Mass on Wednesday, March 2, for Ash Wednesday. **There will be no pepperoni rolls that day to allow us all to abstain from meat together.** The following is taken from the <u>United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) website:</u>

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence.

For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.

- **Tomorrow is a Mass day.** Remember: parents are always welcome to attend with us. We are very excited to have student Lectors and Cantors at Mass again!
- An updated Basketball schedule is attached to this and will be going home with students. The following is from Coach Amanda McCloskey, regarding Basketball: With the great turnout number of kids, Mr. and Mrs. Dorio and I thought we might switch up the Friday basketball days. Since the gym is really packed with 50 plus kids it's a little hard to get every kid a ball and hoop time. We came up with the idea of making individual days for the groups. So we will have PreK through 1st grade one group and

then 2nd through 8th grade another group. This Friday (February 25) we will only have grades 2-8 practice, next week will be PreK-1st only and so on. Also, we decided we will have a little Green and White Basketball Scrimmage Tournament to wrap up the basketball season. That way parents can see what their kids have been up to and learning.
