Dear SMS Families and Friends,

March is the month of St. Joseph! When we think of March, our minds automatically jump to St. Patrick (whom we love as St. Mike's Irish!!), but the Church prays with St. Joseph throughout the month of March, as his feast day is March 19.

Have you ever thought about St. Joseph past his role at the



Nativity or Finding of Jesus in the Temple? Few do. And what a man to contemplate!! Consider what his life must have been like... married to a woman who was found to be pregnant and not by him, faced with a decision to have her stoned or divorced, spoken to in his dreams by angels, forced to travel with his very pregnant wife over 80 miles only to find the only available space for lodging is a cave, very likely the only person to assist at the birth of his adopted son, witness to shepherds and magi visiting with supernatural knowledge that his son was really the Son of God, forced to flee with his family to protect them from an evil king bent on destroying his son (he was the savior of our Savior – literally saving His life!), lived as a refugee – a stranger in a strange land – in Egypt, devout man of God who was tasked with the great responsibility of teaching the Son of God how to pray, how to work, how to treat others, how to grow into his vocation as Savior and Redeemer of mankind, head of the holiest family that ever was or ever will be, spouse to the most pure and blessed woman, died a quiet death surrounded by the two holiest people who ever lived. There is so much more to contemplate about his life than that short synopsis, and I would invite you this month to do so and also to ask for his intercession (his prayers) for you and your family. Above is a depiction of St. Joseph as one of his titles: Terror of demons (a favorite)!

Other titles of St. Joseph to pray with: Light of Patriarchs, Chaste guardian of the Virgin, Diligent protector of Christ, Head of the Holy Family, Joseph most just, Joseph most chaste, Joseph most strong, Joseph most obedient, Mirror of patience, Glory of home life, Guardian of virgins, Hope of the sick, Patron of the dying, Terror of demons, Protector of Holy Church. A bigger list could be found in the <u>Litany to St.</u> <u>Joseph</u>!

Here's the latest peek into our classrooms:

- PreK3 with Mrs. Forsythe learned about their own shadows inside and outside. They also learned how to take care of their teeth. They talked about different community helpers and what they want to be when they grow up. In Religion, they learned about St. Valentine and the beginning of Lent!
- PreK4 with Mrs. Dorio and Mr. Neral got ready for the 100th Day of School in Math by counting to 100 by 1s, 5s, and 10s! In Reading, they worked on vowel sounds. In Science, they learned about the life cycle of a dandelion, and in Religion, they learned about St. Valentine and God's love for US!
- Kindergarteners with Mrs. Toy had lots of fun making predictions on Groundhog's Day! In Science, they are learning about the solar system and how the planets orbit the sun. In Math, they learned about 2-dimensional and 3-dimensional shapes. In Religion with Miss Zgonc, they finished learning about the days of Creation by making posters and reading stories of Creation that brought in Scripture, Art, and Science!
- Ist Graders with Mrs. Maloney are reading from the Billy and Blaze collection and learning capitalization rules. In History, they have read selections from the famous poet Homer and are currently reliving the time of the first Olympics. In Nature Studies, they are focusing on the 5 categories of animals with backbones!
- ^{*} 2nd Graders with Miss Zuschlag are about to finish reading The Courage of Sarah Noble. In Religion with Deacon Marty, they prepared for their Sacrament of Reconciliation by learning the 10 Commandments front to back and back to front! 5 of them also received their First Reconciliation!

- 3rd Graders with Mrs. Endicott are reading Mr. Popper's Penguins in Literature. In Math, they started learning about the properties of multiplication. In Nature Studies, they have been focusing on honey bees, and in Religion, they completed a Lenten lapbook!
- 4th Graders with Mrs. Knicely learned about light behavior and made kaleidoscopes to show light reflection in Science. In History, they finished learning about Mary Queen of Scots (their room is decorated for this!) and the Reformation. They also started delving deeper into the 10 Commandments in Religion!
- 7th and 8th Graders with Deacon Marty propagated jade plants in water and transplanted them in flowerpots after they rooted. In Math, they are cruising through solving algebraic equations with the four different operations. In History, they learned about the War of 1812 and how it affected the world we live in today. They are currently reading David Copperfield by Charles Dickens!
- Music classes with Mrs. Giffone met Zero the Hero on the 100th Day of School and are enjoying patriotic music. In Gym classes, they are jumping rope and learning line dances!
- Art classes with Mrs. Cawley drew winter scenes in perspective, made illuminative calligraphy texts, created works of art in the Surrealist Tradition, drew snowmen from below eye level perspective and aerial perspective, made papier mâché fish, made 3-D Trojan horses, created Grecian pinch pots, drew fish, dogs, elephants, self-portraits, and much more!
