

Fr. Ben Daghir's Corner



Today's first reading comes from 1 Samuel, chapter 16. It's a marvelous narrative of David being called by God. We are in this narrative, but we have to look closely.

Notice that the prophet Samuel judged by appearance as to who would be the anointed son of Jesse's family. The Lord responded to the prophet Samuel, "Do not judge from his appearance or from his lofty stature...not as man sees does God see, because man sees the appearance but the Lord looks into the heart."

Brilliantly, God chooses the least expected. The first seven sons presented to Samuel were not the one chosen by God. In fact, the one chosen by God wasn't even in the starting lineup - he came off the bench. Instead, Jesse had to send for his youngest, least experienced, and weakest son named David who wasn't even there. The Lord then said, "this is the one!"

Then, in one of the most beautiful lines of Scripture, we read "the spirit of the Lord rushed upon David." Let me be clear - the Spirit continues to rush upon those we least expect.

Rarely does God choose the most intelligent, the most obvious, the most qualified, the most athletic, and the most excellent person for a mission. God doesn't get fooled by appearances. He isn't really interested in resumes. In fact, I don't recall reading about an interview process throughout the entire Biblical narrative.

Instead, God simply chooses. He builds upon our weaknesses, vulnerabilities, struggles, fears, worries, anxieties, and inabilities. He defeats Goliath from a little stone through a shepherd boy named David. He transforms the world through a fearful fisherman named Peter. He continuously makes saints out of sinners.

Like I said earlier, we are in this narrative. The question, of course, is which character are we? Are we judging by worldly appearances or are we in David's sandals - humbly ready for adventure with the Lord?
