Fr. Ben Daghir's Corner

The fourth indicator of a vibrant parish is under the heading of "Service and Pastoral care."

The Diocese of Erie offers two main points:

 The parish is actively engaged in proclaiming the Gospel through service to people in need locally, in the wider community, and in the world.
 The parish provides ministry to the homebound and elderly parishioners and those in hospitals, nursing homes, and other care facilities.

*The first point indicates that the proclamation of the Gospel at the parish level not only includes speaking but also service. Also, the parish must serve beyond its small region and into the "wider community, and in the world." *The second point is a great challenge for Holy Spirit Parish. We have homebound in Falls Creek, Sykesville, Reynoldsville, Treasure Lake, DuBois, Luthersburg, Rockton, and a few other areas. We have a hospital, Penn Highlands DuBois. We also have several nursing homes and other care facilities. *The Holy Spirit Parish region is rather large. It takes almost 40 minutes to travel from Stump Creek to the Silver Course at Treasure Lake. We have parishioners even further away in distance. Holy Spirit Parish encompasses various populations. DuBois - 7,400. Treasure Lake - 5,000. Reynoldsville -2,500. Luthersburg - 1,300. Sykesville -1,100. Falls Creek - 1,000. Rockton -840.
