"Do you believe that God has created you to be a Saint?" I once had a spiritual director ask me that question. It's one of those questions that makes a person reconsider everything about everything. The question leads a person to ask other questions such as: "What's my purpose?" and "Who am I?" and "Why do I exist?" Even better, the question encourages us to think about others. "What, then, are others built for?"

The question "Do you believe that God has created you to be a Saint?" really changed my worldview. I remember spending a Saturday afternoon at the Inner Harbor in Baltimore thinking about the question. I looked out and saw thousands of people around the harbor. I saw all the traffic, the buses, the students going in and out of the National Aquarium, the skyscrapers, the boats, people begging for food on street corners, police officers on their bikes, families, a street preacher, and many others. Instead of seeing an ordinary day at the Inner Harbor in Baltimore, I saw something different. God has created each person to be a Saint. In fact, it is this vision, this worldview that is Catholic.
