Fr. Ben Daghir's Corner

Where was I on the morning of September 11, 2001? I was two weeks away from turning 9 years old on the morning of September 11, 2001. I was in third grade at St. Mary's Parochial School in St. Marys, Pennsylvania. I remember during the morning, shortly after 9:00 a.m., our teacher left the room and was speaking with some other teachers in the hallway. Our teacher never left the room.

We then continued our class and then she left the room again just a few minutes later. We then went over to St. Mary's Parish (which was across the parking lot) and began to pray. I still remember the pew that I was sitting in while we prayed with the entire school. I honestly don't remember if we left school early or finished the day. I remember going home and my parents informed me of what had happened. I still remember seeing the television screen. I don't know if my generation really talks much about what it was like to see everything on television at 8 years old. There are some things that a young child will never be able to understand. One thing that a young kid does come to learn is that not everything is a movie, especially when your parents, grandparents, and neighbors have tears around you.

As an 8 year old kid, the morning of September 11, 2001 opened my young eyes to sin and to virtue. Concerning sin, I didn't understand why someone would do such a wicked thing. Concerning virtue, I found the firefighters and police officers who went up the towers to be remarkable. I think those men and women put a face to virtue, which is the greatest gift one can give to younger generations.

Even though it took me years to recognize it, I also learned on the morning of September 11, 2001 the most valuable lesson my Catholic education offered me. As Catholics, we must pray.
