Fr. Ben Daghir's Corner

I have had several people ask me, "So, how do you prepare your homilies?" I have also been asked, "How long does it take you to prepare your homilies?" First, I prepare my homilies by following the method of Pope Francis. He recommends that a preacher first calls upon the Holy Spirit to guide one's preparation. After this, I slowly and intently read through the scripture readings. I then let my imagination run a little - every idea and thought is fair game. I then stop with the ideas and let them sit still (which is extremely difficult to do). I then go to YouTube and listen to better preachers than I am on the given subject (which I believe is so important). These preachers are often Catholic and sometimes Protestant. I simply listen to them like a student listens to a teacher. Also, I will often listen to a few Catholic preachers in Spanish on the same topic. Then, I often will consult another source or two (normally I am reading from authors, preachers, theologians, philosophers, sociologists, etc. that are much more intelligent than I am). At this point, I have heard from 5-6 better preachers than me. I synthesize their work and build upon them. I also think about what people need to hear, what people have told me they think they need to hear, and what seems appropriate for the given audience.

I then just visualize the homily (maybe while driving or hitting golf balls or going for a run or sitting in the chapel). Then, the moment before preaching I pray "Let them hear You, not me."

"How long does it take me to prepare a homily?" I never prepare the day of preaching. I always sleep on it (and often visualize it before going to sleep). It's hard for me to answer "how long?" because I prepare in waves (meaning that I visualize it for a minute or two and then an hour later I visualize another part and so forth). In other words, I try to let the homily permeate into my life throughout the day -I want to live with it for a little.

If I haven't lived with the homily then why would I ever think that someone listening would live with my homily? Just as I prepare my homilies, I want you to live with it for a little, off and on, to think about it during random moments - especially when you need to hear it.
