Fr. Ben Daghir's Corner

The second indicator of a vibrant parish is under the heading of "Worship and the Sacraments."

1. The Diocese of Erie offers six main points:

Liturgical celebrations are properly and thoughtfully prepared and well attended with full, active, and conscious participation.

2. Homilies are relevant, challenging, and faithful to the Gospel and church teaching. Parishioners are taught how to grow and are inspired to live as disciples of Jesus Christ.

3. Sacramental preparation is thoughtfully and properly planned and conducted in accordance with approved guidelines and diocesan policies.

4. The prayer and devotional life of parishioners is supported and nourished beyond the Sunday liturgy and the sacraments.

5. Music as a part of worship is of high quality.

6. The RCIA is implemented and its rituals are celebrated at the proper times.

As I look at these six main points, I am asking the following questions:

Where are we strong? How can we build upon our strengths? Where are we weak? What approaches can we take to strengthen our weaknesses?

I encourage you to ask the same questions.

PRAYER AND FINDING GOD IN THE SILENCE

February 25, 11:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. at Bethany Retreat Center, Frenchville, PA

Are you looking to deepen your spiritual relationship with the Lord? If so, this Lenten retreat may be just what you're looking for. Dr. Jan Satterlee will present prayer as communication with God. She will provide examples of prayer and unpack the three expressions of prayer: vocal, meditative, and contemplative.

Additionally, Dr. Jan will explore The Lord's Prayer. Using the Catechism and Scripture from both the Old and New Testaments, Dr. Jan will discuss the seven petitions, what we are asking for, and why we pray them for everyone and not just for ourselves.

Finally, Dr. Jan will discuss roadblocks to prayer, such as distractions, wandering thoughts, expectations, dryness in prayer, and the darkness of prayer.
