# **EUCHARISTIC LOVE 150 Years of Eucharistic Love** in Bennetts Valley

As we parishioners of St. Joseph Church celebrate our 150th Anniversary of the Catholic Church presence in Bennetts Valley and the celebration of the Holy Eucharist since 1872, I believe it is essential to take a close look at the parts of the Mass that we celebrate every day.

From this weekend on until the end of October, I will share with you important details on the parts of the Mass.

## So let us begin...

Did you know that the parts of the Mass - its structure - is all from the Bible and the early Church Fathers? The following reflections are excerpts based on Dr. Edward Sri's book and cd series entitled: A Biblical Walk through the Mass.

To begin, the Introductory Rites of the Mass help us prepare our hearts and minds to enter into a profound relationship with God. As we come into the Church, we bless ourselves with Holy Water and as we walk down the aisle, we genuflect and make the Sign of the Cross before we enter the pew.

As Mass begins, the song is announced, the opening hymn is sung, and the priest enters the Sanctuary and venerates the Altar. He then leads all of us in the Sign of the Cross by saying, "In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit." In the (Book of Ezekiel Ch 9:4-6) describe some faithful people of Israel who received a mark in the shape of an X on their forehead that would "set them apart from the rest of the corrupt culture and served as a sign of Divine Protection." (Dr. Sri - Pg 25, 2nd paragraph)

Therefore, there is power in the Name of God; our Heavenly Father, in the Name of His Son our Lord Jesus Christ and of the Holy Spirit in whose fruits and gifts strengthen our lives to live for Christ. (Galatians 5: 22) (Is. Ch. 11:2)

When making the Sign of the Cross at Mass and throughout the day, we need to do it slowly and reverently as we raise our right hand to our forehead and say, "In the Name of the Father," and then extend it to our stomach area and say, "and of the Son," then to our left shoulder and to our right shoulder saying, "and of the Holy Spirit." Amen!

My friends, review this teaching and bear this in mind each time you make the **Sign of the Cross**. The amazing Love of Jesus in the celebration of the Eucharist can make us ready to pray with all our heart the prayers at the beginning of Mass when we make the Sign of the Cross.

#### SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION

Baptism – A baptism preparation session is required of all parents wishing to have their child(ren) baptized. Parents must be registered parishioners. Sessions are held periodically at parishes throughout the Deanery. It is always preferred that baptisms be celebrated during a regular Sunday Liturgy. Call the Parish office for more information.

Eucharist - Children preparing for Eucharist (Gr. 3) and who are active in the Faith Formation process (including Catholic School children) are eligible to enter the sacramental preparation sessions.

Confirmation – High School youth who are entering the 11th grade and who are active in the Faith Formation process or attend a Catholic High School since 9th grade are eligible to enter the Confirmation preparation sessions.

R.C.I.A. - Rite of Christian Initiation for adults are initiated into the Church through this process. Any individual who may be interested in becoming a member of the Catholic Church is invited. Please call the Church office.

### SACRAMENTS OF VOCATION

Priesthood/Permanent Deaconate – Men who feel that they may be being called to the vocational life of Priesthood or Deaconate can contact the pastor at any time or call the Diocesan Vocation Office at 814-824-1111.

Matrimony – There is a required preparation process which normally includes 3 sessions with the pastor and an Engagement Encounter or Nova experience. Please notify the pastor at least 6 months prior to the anticipated date of marriage.

#### SÁCRAMENTS OF HEALING

Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick-Celebrated for all who are seriously ill annually at a parish Liturgy. The Sacrament is also available upon request.

Reconciliation – The sacrament is celebrated weekly on Saturday from 4:45 – 5:15 p.m., or anytime by request. Parish Penance services are celebrated during Advent and Lent. Children preparing for Reconciliation (Gr. 2) and who are active in the Faith Formation process (including Catholic School children) are eligible to enter the sacramental preparation sessions.
