Changes to the Communion Rite

Since 2003, the posture of the people during the Communion Rite in the Diocese of Erie has differed from the practice of most dioceses in the United States. Since that time, much has changed. After much reflection, Bishop Lawrence Persico has determined that the time is opportune for us to return to the practice of kneeling after the singing of the Lamb of God. Once the people return after receiving Holy Communion, they may kneel or be seated. All will stand at the "Let us pray" for the prayer after Communion. This restored practice is intended to help to unify posture and assist those parishioners who are unable to stand for long periods of time, as well as bring our practice into union with our neighboring dioceses. Those who are unable to kneel should feel free to sit instead. This directive goes into effect the First Sunday of Advent, 4:00 p.m. on Saturday, November 27, 2021.

<u>Cemetery Memorials Removal:</u> To begin preparing the cemetery for the winter months, Monday, November 29th all memorials you have placed on the graves of your loved ones are to be removed. Since the Christmas season follows so closely, any memorials you would like to place for this season <u>can replace the items of the prior seasons</u>. The <u>deadline to remove all items except for the solar lighting must be removed by Tuesday, February 1, 2022.</u>

Re-membering Our Sunday Story (Part 2)

Excerpts of the Pastoral Letter in Pandemic
One of my favorite stories in the Gospel of
Luke is the Emmaus story. This event is centered
around how the two disciples: Cleopas and a friend
had encountered the Risen Christ while they were
walking on the road to a village called Emmaus which
was seven miles from Jerusalem. They realized it was
the Risen Lord walking with them only after they
encountered Jesus at meal with them in the Breaking
of the Bread. At this time, please read the Gospel of
Luke 24:13-35.

Bishop Persico in his recent pastoral letter to all entitled "Re-member Our Sunday Story" uses this Emmaus story at the beginning of his letter. The reason for this is because the Emmaus story is similar to our story in our faith journey and walk with Jesus our Lord. The Emmaus disciples were sadden by the news of Jesus of Nazareth's Death. Yet, these disciples did not lose hope.

The Bishop writes, "In many ways the Emmaus story is our story as we emerge from the COVID-19 pandemic. However, it has also been our story every time we have gathered in our parish communities for the celebration of the Eucharist. Therefore, it is *our Sunday story*, and it is good for us to find in it glimmers of hope and new life in Christ." (Paragraph 2 of his pastoral letter)

Also, the Bishop says that the Eucharist is the place where we can bring our struggles, especially all the distress, the inconveniences and the losses that many people and even we ourselves have experienced during the pandemic. His pastoral letter is to encourage us to remember our Sunday story of our participation at Mass and to take the Emmaus story as our own journey with the Risen Christ.

We, at St. Joseph Church, can learn more about the Eucharist and share our Sunday story by the following goals now and into 2022:

- Bringing people back to Mass. Invite a family member or neighbor.
- Attending the Adult Faith Formation class — "A Biblical Walk with the Eucharist."
- Attending Faith Formation Family events in our social hall.
- Preparing for our 150th Anniversary.
- Sharing faith on a one-day field trip during the summer.

SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION

Baptism – A baptism preparation session is required of all parents wishing to have their child(ren) baptized. Parents must be registered parishioners. Sessions are held periodically at parishes throughout the Deanery. It is always preferred that baptisms be celebrated during a regular Sunday Liturgy. Call the Parish office for more information.

Eucharist – Children preparing for Eucharist (Gr. 3) and who are active in the Faith Formation process (including Catholic School children) are eligible to enter the sacramental preparation sessions.

Confirmation – High School youth who are entering the 11th grade and who are active in the Faith Formation process or attend a Catholic High School since 9th grade are eligible to enter the Confirmation preparation sessions.

R.C.I.A. - Rite of Christian Initiation for adults are initiated into the Church through this process. Any individual who may be interested in becoming a member of the Catholic Church is invited. Please call the Church office.

SACRAMENTS OF VOCATION

Priesthood/Permanent Deaconate - Men who feel that they may be being called to the vocational life of Priesthood or Deaconate can contact the pastor at any time or call the Diocesan Vocation Office at 814-824-1111.

Matrimony – There is a required preparation process which normally includes 3 sessions with the pastor and an Engagement Encounter or Nova experience. Please notify the pastor at least 6 months prior to the anticipated date of marriage.

SACRAMENTS OF HEALING

Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick-Celebrated for all who are seriously ill annually at a parish Liturgy. The Sacrament is also available upon request. Reconciliation - The sacrament is celebrated weekly on Saturday from 4:45 - 5:15 p.m, or anytime by request. Parish Penance services are celebrated during Advent and Lent. Children preparing for Reconciliation (Gr. 2) and who are active in the Faith Formation process (including Catholic School children) are eligible to enter the sacramental preparation sessions.
