Remain in Order to Grow

Initially, the word *remain* sounds like a nonactive, maybe even a boring verb. This is especially true if it is in the context of a statement like: "Don't do anything, just remain." However, there are many ways this verb can be productive such as the following:

A pilot remains at a safe altitude while the storm clouds are active underneath.

A soldier might remind a discouraged fellow soldier by saying, "remain faithful to our country."

A hunter may tell a beginner with whom he is hunting to "Remain quiet and be still especially when you see the turkey."

Spring rain is necessary for the ground to remain moist in order for plants, vegetables and flowers to grow.

A concerned close friend could directly say, "Remain faithful to your spouse."

A priest and minister may often say, "Remain close to God in prayer."

These are all examples of **remaining** for good reasons of growing, of learning, and for protection.

In this weekend's Gospel Reading John 15:1-8, Jesus uses the word *remain* eight times. His message can be summed-up in four ways to remain. We are to *remain* in Him. *to remain* on the vine; *to remain* in order to bear much fruit; and to remain in His Word.

We remain in our personal friendship with Christ by spending time in prayer everyday. Ask yourself, "Are you striving to do this?"

We remain on the vine like healthy branches by staying connected to other members of the Church and receiving the Sacraments Jesus gives us. Do we have some fellowship with other members of St. Joseph Church?

We remain in knowledge of Jesus by reading His Word as recorded in the Bible. We should ask ourselves, "Are we taking time to read the Bible and even memorizing Scripture verses?" By praying, staying connected to parishioners, and reflecting on God's Word will enable each of us to bear the spiritual fruits of love, joy, peace, kindness, patience, faithfulness, etc. (Galatians 5:22) These fruits are Jesus's personal Gifts to us that will fill our souls in order to grow as His disciples and to remain healthy in our interior spiritual life. Ask for them today as much as you need, "and it will be done for you." (John 15:7b)

SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION

Baptism - A baptism preparation session is required of all parents wishing to have their child(ren) baptized. Parents must be registered parishioners. Sessions are held periodically at parishes throughout the Deanery. It is always preferred that baptisms be celebrated during a regular Sunday Liturgy. Call the Parish office for more information.

Eucharist - Children preparing for Eucharist (Gr. 3) and who are active in the Faith Formation process (including Catholic School children) are eligible to enter the sacramental preparation sessions.

Confirmation – High School youth who are entering the 11th grade and who are active in the Faith Formation process or attend a Catholic High School since 9th grade are eligible to enter the Confirmation preparation sessions.

R.C.I.A. - Rite of Christian Initiation for adults are initiated into the Church through this process. Any individual who may be interested in becoming a member of the Catholic Church is invited. Please call the Church office.

SACRAMENTS OF VOCATION

Priesthood/Permanent Deaconate – Men who feel that they may be being called to the vocational life of Priesthood or Deaconate can contact the pastor at any time or call the Diocesan Vocation Office at 814-824-1111.

Matrimony – There is a required preparation process which normally includes 3 sessions with the pastor and an Engagement Encounter or Nova experience. Please notify the pastor at least 6 months prior to the anticipated date of marriage.

SACRAMÉNTS OF HEALING

Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick-Celebrated for all who are seriously ill annually at a parish Liturgy. The Sacrament is also available upon request. Reconciliation – The sacrament is celebrated weekly on Saturday from 4:45 – 5:15 p.m, or anytime by request. Parish Penance services are celebrated during Advent and Lent. Children preparing for Reconciliation (Gr. 2) and who are active in the Faith Formation process (including Catholic School children) are eligible to enter the sacramental preparation sessions.
