Please keep them all in your prayers as you remember and honor all who served.






The 40 Days for Life Campaign ended last Sunday. Let us still remember to prayer for these innocents every day.

Sharing Our Faith Series



One of the most interesting and inspiring person in all of the Old Testament writing is the Prophet Elijah. He is called by God to ultimately defend the faith of God's people and to bring them back to a right relationship with God. In this Reading Elijah is fed by a woman in a city named Zarephath. There is a drought causing a famine in the land, but in spite of that, Elijah tells her that "the jar of flour shall not go empty nor the jug of oil run dry, until the day when the Lord sends rain upon the earth" (1 Kings 17:14b) The woman puts her faith in this promise of God's Words and she obeyed.

—Can we trust and believe that our Good Lord will provide for each of us even though at times of the shortage of foods and certain supplies of things during the pandemic? Even right now?

Psalm: 146:7, 8-9, 9-10 (16)

Just as God provided for the widow and Elijah in the First Reading, so too the Psalmist boldly proclaims that "the Lord keeps faith forever . . ." (146:6)

—We can then ask ourselves: In what areas of my life have I sensed our Lord being faithful to me in the midst of my spiritual hunger?

Scripture: Second Reading at Mass Hebrews 9:24-28

The last several weekends we have been hearing about the High Priesthood of Jesus our Lord from the Book of Hebrews. Jesus's perfect offering of Himself to God the Father is the sacrifice "to take away sin." (Heb 9:28) Jesus passed on this priesthood to His Apostles at the Last Supper to remember this sacrifice as they offer the Body and Blood of Christ at every Mass in which Jesus said "do this in memory of Me." (Lk 22:19b) On this Vocation Awareness Sunday let us be thankful for the ordained priesthood and pray for more vocations to the priesthood and the religious life

Gospel Reading at Mass: Mark 12:38-44

In our Gospel Reading this poor widow gave all she had to put in the synagogue collection —"two small coins worth a few cents" (Mark 12:42)

—What can we get from this extreme act of sacrifice in every vocation in life: marriage, single life, priesthood or religious life? We need to give our hearts completely to Jesus our Lord. Jesus is able to teach us how to live simply, holy and good lives.

SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION

Baptism – A baptism preparation session is required of all parents wishing to have their child(ren) baptized. Parents must be registered parishioners. Sessions are held periodically at parishes throughout the Deanery. It is always preferred that baptisms be celebrated during a regular Sunday Liturgy. Call the Parish office for more information.

Eucharist – Children preparing for Eucharist (Gr. 3) and who are active in the Faith Formation process (including Catholic School children) are eligible to enter the sacramental preparation sessions.

Confirmation – High School youth who are entering the 11th grade and who are active in the Faith Formation process or attend a Catholic High School since 9th grade are eligible to enter the Confirmation preparation sessions.

R.C.I.A. - Rite of Christian Initiation for adults are initiated into the Church through this process. Any individual who may be interested in becoming a member of the Catholic Church is invited. Please call the Church office.

SACRAMENTS OF VOCATION

Priesthood/Permanent Deaconate - Men who feel that they may be being called to the vocational life of Priesthood or Deaconate can contact the pastor at any time or call the Diocesan Vocation Office at 814-824-1111.

Matrimony – There is a required preparation process which normally includes 3 sessions with the pastor and an Engagement Encounter or Nova experience. Please notify the pastor at least 6 months prior to the anticipated date of marriage.

SACRAMENTS OF HEALING

Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick-Celebrated for all who are seriously ill annually at a parish Liturgy. The Sacrament is also available upon request. Reconciliation - The sacrament is celebrated weekly on Saturday from 4:45 - 5:15 p.m, or anytime by request. Parish Penance services are celebrated during Advent and Lent. Children preparing for Reconciliation (Gr. 2) and who are active in the Faith Formation process (including Catholic School children) are eligible to enter the sacramental preparation sessions.
