Love in Sacred Scriptures

When you see or hear the word *Love*, what immediately comes to mind? I believe for most of us we think of God. Why, because God is the very definition of *love* as St. John says in (1 Jn 4:16) that "God is *love*." Family members and close friends and neighbors also come to mind when we think of *love*.

We all know that this **big word love** has a variety of meanings which has been expressed in song, poetry, as well as in theatre and in movies during the past century. But, this weekend's Gospel calls us to listen to what Jesus has to say about *love*.

When Jesus was asked by the scholar: "which commandment in the law is the greatest? He said to him, "You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all our mind. This is the greatest and the first commandment. The second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself. The whole law and the prophets depend on these two commandments." (Mt 22:36-39) Jesus is answering the question by quoting both Old Testament Scriptures Deuteronomy 6:5 and Leviticus 19:18.

Very simply, we need to ask: How are we doing in living this command? Are we loving God with all our heart by spending time in prayer everyday? Are we loving God by believing that God loves us, created us, and wants all that is good for us? Are we loving God by accepting His Will and Plan for our lives? Are we reading the Bible and thinking good thoughts about God and neighbors?

Next, we can ask: Are we loving our neighbors by respecting them, helping them when we are called upon, and praying for them? Do we see God in their life? Finally, do we take care of ourselves? Are we loving ourselves enough with proper nourishment, rest, exercise and developing our learning capacity and talents. Answer these questions this week.

The following are more Sacred Scriptures on Love ...

Micah 6:8 "You have been told, O man, what is good and what the Lord requires of you only to do the right and to *love* goodness and to walk humbly with your God."

1 Corinthians:13:4-8 "Love is patient, love is kind . . . it bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things and endures all things. Love never fails."

Ephesians: 3:19 "To know the *love* of Christ that surpasses knowledge, so that you may be filled with all the fullness of God."

SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION

Baptism – A baptism preparation session is required of all parents wishing to have their child(ren) baptized. Parents must be registered parishioners. Sessions are held periodically at parishes throughout the Deanery. It is always preferred that baptisms be celebrated during a regular Sunday Liturgy. Call the Parish office for more information.

Eucharist - Children preparing for Eucharist (Gr. 3) and who are active in the Faith Formation process (including Catholic School children) are eligible to enter the sacramental preparation sessions.

Confirmation – High School youth who are entering the 11th grade and who are active in the Faith Formation process or attend a Catholic High School since 9th grade are eligible to enter the Confirmation preparation sessions.

R.C.I.A. – Rite of Christian Initiation for adults are initiated into the Church through this process. Any individual who may be interested in becoming a member of the Catholic Church is invited. Please call the Church office.

SACRAMENTS OF VOCATION

Priesthood/Permanent Deaconate - Men who feel that they may be being called to the vocational life of Priesthood or Deaconate can contact the pastor at any time or call the Diocesan Vocation Office at 814-824-1111.

Matrimony – There is a required preparation process which normally includes 3 sessions with the pastor and an Engagement Encounter or Nova experience. Please notify the pastor at least 6 months prior to the anticipated date of marriage.

SACRAMENTS OF HEALING

Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick – Is celebrated for all who are seriously ill annually at a parish Liturgy. The Sacrament is also available anytime upon request.

Reconciliation – The sacrament is celebrated weekly on Saturday from 4:45 – 5:15 p.m, or anytime by request. Parish Penance services are celebrated during Advent and Lent. Children preparing for Reconciliation (Gr. 2) and who are active in the Faith Formation process (including Catholic School children) are eligible to enter the sacramental preparation sessions.
