The Spiritual Fruits We Need

Jesus said to His Apostles just before His Ascension—40 days after His Resurrection, "I send down upon you the promise of the Father. Remain here in the city until you are clothed with power from on high." (Luke 24:49) We believe that ten days after Jesus's Ascension He sent the Holy Spirit down upon the Apostles. This is Pentecost Sunday which we celebrate today.

There were many spiritual gifts that Jesus gave to His Apostles and Disciples from that first Pentecost thereafter. Some of these very important gifts are *wisdom, understanding, knowledge, council, fortitude, piety and fear of the Lord.* "(Isaiah 11:3) These are the gifts that we receive at our Confirmation.

Also, to be emphasized is what the Holy Spirit is willing to do for us that will make our lives fruitful. The Fruits of the Holy Spirit of "*love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control*" (Galatians 5:22) are released within our lives in greater abundance if our hearts are open. These fruits are active to a degree within our lives. But, when we experience distress, then that is a perfect time to pray for peace. Another example is when we are sad, then we can pray for joy.

Our Lord knows that we need a refueling in our Spiritual life. To help you I offer the insert today as a Spiritual exercise you can do at home which can serve as a prayer for these Fruits of the Holy Spirit. Simply do the following: To begin ... Place all the Fruit of the Holy Spirit on all the branches of the tree. Place the tree with the Fruit at an obvious location in your house (your refrigerator door, an end table, etc.). Choose a Fruit which you *most need* in your life for that week. Remove it and place it where you will see it throughout that week. Whenever you see this Fruit, you will be reminded to pray to make that Fruit stronger in your life. Do this step with each of the Fruit for the following weeks.

This activity can help you receive the Fruits of the Holy Spirit whether you are at home, at work, at school or traveling. **Come Holy Spirit!**

SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION

Baptism – A baptism preparation session is required of all parents wishing to have their child(ren) baptized. Parents must be registered parishioners. Sessions are held periodically at parishes throughout the Deanery. It is always preferred that baptisms be celebrated during a regular Sunday Liturgy. Call the Parish office for more information.

Eucharist - Children preparing for Eucharist (Gr. 3) and who are active in the Faith Formation process (including Catholic School children) are eligible to enter the sacramental preparation sessions.

Confirmation – High School youth who are entering the 11th grade and who are active in the Faith Formation process or attend a Catholic High School since 9th grade are eligible to enter the Confirmation preparation sessions.

R.C.I.A. - Rite of Christian Initiation for adults are initiated into the Church through this process. Any individual who may be interested in becoming a member of the Catholic Church is invited. Please call the Church office.

SACRAMENTS OF VOCATION

Priesthood/Permanent Deaconate – Men who feel that they may be being called to the vocational life of Priesthood or Deaconate can contact the pastor at any time or call the Diocesan Vocation Office at 814-824-1111.

Matrimony – There is a required preparation process which normally includes 3 sessions with the pastor and an Engagement Encounter or Nova experience. Please notify the pastor at least 6 months prior to the anticipated date of marriage.

SACRAMĚNTŚ OF HEALING

Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick-Celebrated for all who are seriously ill annually at a parish Liturgy. The Sacrament is also available upon request. Reconciliation – The sacrament is celebrated weekly on Saturday from 4:45 – 5:15 p.m, or anytime by request. Parish Penance services are celebrated during Advent and Lent. Children preparing for Reconciliation (Gr. 2) and who are active in the Faith Formation process (including Catholic School children) are eligible to enter the sacramental preparation sessions.
