What Do You Believe?

When any of us think about what we really believe in, we know it will involve our belief in God. Something as important as our belief is a question we try to answer throughout lifetime. Often, we make the effort to name something that will strengthen our belief in God — thus that is the purpose of praying **The Creed** together at Mass every Sunday.

At Mass we are naming in whom we believe as we pray about God the Father in the first sentence: "I believe in one God the Father Almighty, Maker of Heaven and earth. of all things visible and invisible." As we pray **the Creed**, we believe that God is One not many- and He created each of us. This is something God did, not us. He created everything physical we can see as the story of creation tells us in the Book of Genesis. (Gn 1:1-27) Also, as Dr. Ed Sri says in his book The Mass, God created "spiritual beings, the angels whose beauty, strength, power and majesty far exceed the most spectacular mountains and valleys, seas and oceans, constellations and supernovas."(pg.93) It also reflects the language of St. Paul, who referred to the creation of all things "in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible." (Colossians 1:16)

The Creed

The Creed is a Trinitarian Prayer of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. Similar to the way **the Creed** begins to describe God the Father as One, so too, does this part of **the Creed** begin to describe our Lord Jesus Christ as One. Jesus is the One and Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all

ages. Jesus is from God the Father before all time. The litany of Who Jesus is continues: *God from God* (Jesus is God from God), *Light from Light*, (Jesus the Light of the world is from the Eternal Light of God), *True God from true God*, (Jesus is truly God the Son from the True God the Father), *begotten not made*, (Jesus is from God the Father and not a creature

created by God), *consubstantial with the Father* (This means that "Jesus the Son is the same substance as God the Father.") (First Council of Nicaea in AD 325) It was through Jesus the Son of God and the Word of God that "all things were made."

The big question now remains —In what needy or desperate time in your life did you need God the most? How did you express **your belief**? What did you pray and or do?

What do you believe? You believe God is helping you and He is here and now and will be in the future. Amen!

Groups or individuals wishing to have information published in the bulletin are asked to submit the information in writing, by email or by phone by Monday at 10:00 a.m.

SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION

Baptism – A baptism preparation session is required of all parents wishing to have their child(ren) baptized. Parents must be registered parishioners. Sessions are held periodically at parishes throughout the Deanery. It is always preferred that baptisms be celebrated during a regular Sunday Liturgy. Call the Parish office for more information.

Eucharist - Children preparing for Eucharist (Gr. 3) and who are active in the Faith Formation process (including Catholic School children) are eligible to enter the sacramental preparation sessions.

Confirmation – High School youth who are entering the 11th grade and who are active in the Faith Formation process or attend a Catholic High School since 9th grade are eligible to enter the Confirmation preparation sessions.

R.C.I.A. - Rite of Christian Initiation for adults are initiated into the Church through this process. Any individual who may be interested in becoming a member of the Catholic Church is invited. Please call the Church office.

SACRAMENTS OF VOCATION

Priesthood/Permanent Deaconate – Men who feel that they may be being called to the vocational life of Priesthood or Deaconate can contact the pastor at any time or call the Diocesan Vocation Office at 814-824-1111.

Matrimony - There is a required preparation process which normally includes 3 sessions with the pastor and an Engagement Encounter or Nova experience. Please notify the pastor at least 6 months prior to the anticipated date of marriage.

SACRAMENTS OF HEALING

Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick-Celebrated for all who are seriously ill annually at a parish Liturgy. The Sacrament is also available upon request.

Reconciliation – The sacrament is celebrated weekly on Saturday from 4:45 – 5:15 p.m, or anytime by request. Parish Penance services are celebrated during Advent and Lent. Children preparing for Reconciliation (Gr. 2) and who are active in the Faith Formation process (including Catholic School children) are eligible to enter the sacramental preparation sessions.
