The Most Holy Trinity **Memorial Day** The Visitation of Mary

I.**The Most Holy Trinity** is Who we celebrate in this most Holy Solemnity this Sunday: God the Father, Jesus the Son, and the Holy Spirit. We celebrate that the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit have been revealed in the human history of creation, salvation and of sanctification (to be made holy).

In the Book of Genesis we read about the creation story of our universe, world, all living things and man and woman, who were especially made in God's Image and Likeness. We also read in Genesis and throughout the Old Testament about the fall of Adam and Eve and God as a loving Father made a covenant through Abraham, Issacs, Jacob and Moses and the prophets in order to bring man and woman back into a right relationship.

We then read in the New Testament of the Bible that in the fullness of time. God sent His Son Jesus to teach us about God's Kingdom and through His Death on the Cross and His Resurrection, we now have free access to salvation and everlasting life. By receiving God, and the Holy Spirit through the Sacraments of the Church, we can live a holy life that will prepare us for life in Heaven after our life here on earth. We receive this new life of the Holy Trinity —Three Persons in One — at our Baptism. Jesus commissioned His Apostles to baptize as He says in this weekend's Gospel Reading: "Go, therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the Name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit (Matthew 28:19).

II. Memorial Day is a very blessed national holiday when we remember all of our loved ones who had died and especially, we honor all men and women who had served our country and the many who had given the supreme sacrifice in defending our country. Visiting the cemetery and praying for our deceased loved ones and friends is the most important activity we can do to remember them.

III. The Visitation of Mary is a special feast day that we celebrate also on this Memorial Day, May 31. At this feast we reflect on Mary who had just received the announcement from the Angel Gabriel that God had chosen Her to be the Mother of His only Begotten Son — Who "will be great and will be called Son of the Most High." (Luke 1:32a) "Mary set out and traveled to the hill country in haste to a town of Judah where she entered the house of Zechariah and greeted Elizabeth." (Luke 1:39-40)

Mary needed to visit Elizabeth in order to share the amazing experience She had. Elizabeth in turn expressed to Mary the joy of her infant who leapt in her womb upon hearing the news. Elizabeth acknowledged that "Mary is the Mother of my Lord." (Luke 1:43)

SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION

Baptism – A baptism preparation session is required of all parents wishing to have their child(ren) baptized. Parents must be registered parishioners. Sessions are held periodically at parishes throughout the Deanery. It is always preferred that baptisms be celebrated during a regular Sunday Liturgy. Call the Parish office for more information.

Eucharist - Children preparing for Eucharist (Gr. 3) and who are active in the Faith Formation process (including Catholic School children) are eligible to enter the sacramental preparation sessions.

Confirmation – High School youth who are entering the 11th grade and who are active in the Faith Formation process or attend a Catholic High School since 9th grade are eligible to enter the Confirmation preparation sessions.

R.C.I.A. - Rite of Christian Initiation for adults are initiated into the Church through this process. Any individual who may be interested in becoming a member of the Catholic Church is invited. Please call the Church office.

SACRAMENTS OF VOCATION

Priesthood/Permanent Deaconate – Men who feel that they may be being called to the vocational life of Priesthood or Deaconate can contact the pastor at any time or call the Diocesan Vocation Office at 814-824-1111.

Matrimony – There is a required preparation process which normally includes 3 sessions with the pastor and an Engagement Encounter or Nova experience. Please notify the pastor at least 6 months prior to the anticipated date of marriage.

SACRAMENTS OF HEALING

Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick-Celebrated for all who are seriously ill annually at a parish Liturgy. The Sacrament is also available upon request. Reconciliation – The sacrament is celebrated weekly on Saturday from 4:45 – 5:15 p.m, or anytime by request. Parish Penance services are celebrated during Advent and Lent. Children preparing for Reconciliation (Gr. 2) and who are active in the Faith Formation process (including Catholic School children) are eligible to enter the sacramental preparation sessions.
