The Second Reading at Mass Saint Clare of Assisi and Her Eucharistic Miracle

In continuation of the Liturgy of the Word is the Second Reading at Mass that I will share at this time. The Second Reading at Mass is proclaimed after the Psalm Response and before the Gospel. The Second Reading is only read at Mass on Sundays and on Holy Days. The Second Reading includes the following Letters and Books of the New Testament in the Bible: Acts of the Apostles and the Letters to the following Christian communities as well as to certain people: Romans, Corinthians, Galatians, Ephesians, Philippians, Colossians, Thessalonians, Timothy, Titus, Philemon, Hebrews, James, Peter, John, Jude and the Book of Revelations.

Most of the time, the Second Reading at Mass is taken from the above Letters from St. Paul when he admonishes, consoles, and directs the Christians of the early Church in each one of those communities.

It is very important for us to know the situation of those first Christian Communities and the Teachings of St. Paul about family life, marriage, the leaders, and the teaching about Jesus our Lord. This is relevant to us today as Dr. Ed Sri writes in his book: "We find our own story in their story. For the Church we encounter in the Second Reading is the same Church today." (Dr. Ed Sri, The Mass, Page 78.)

May each of us take time to reflect on how these wise words of the Second Reading at Mass can help and our life of faith in the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit.

Saint Clare of Assisi and Her Eucharistic Miracle

We all know of Saint Francis of Assisi, well. Saint Clare of Assisi was a friend of Saint Francis who along with several other women became the first nuns (religious sisters) of the Franciscan Order.

As the story goes, eventually, Sister Clare became the Mother Superior of the Order. At this particular time of the history of Italy, there were attacks by invaders in certain towns and villages. The Emperor Fredrick II of Sweden ordered Saracen soldiers to attack the city of Assisi. In his book The History of St. Clare, Tommaso da Celano describes basically that as the Saracen soldiers were approaching the convent to attack it, Saint Clare held high the Monstrance with a consecrated Host of our Lord incased inside toward the Saracen soldiers. Immediately, they turned around and ran away. The Risen Lord protected them from any further attempts of invaders. This is another Eucharistic Miracle.

BULLETIN INFORMATION

Groups or individuals wishing to have information published in the bulletin are asked to submit the information in writing, by email or by phone by Monday at 10:00 a.m.

SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION

Baptism – A baptism preparation session is required of all parents wishing to have their child(ren) baptized. Parents must be registered parishioners. Sessions are held periodically at parishes throughout the Deanery. It is always preferred that baptisms be celebrated during a regular Sunday Liturgy. Call the Parish office for more information.

Eucharist – Children preparing for Eucharist (Gr. 3) and who are active in the Faith Formation process (including Catholic School children) are eligible to enter the sacramental preparation sessions.

Confirmation – High School youth who are entering the 11th grade and who are active in the Faith Formation process or attend a Catholic High School since 9th grade are eligible to enter the Confirmation preparation sessions.

R.C.I.A. – Rite of Christian Initiation for adults are initiated into the Church through this process. Any individual who may be interested in becoming a member of the Catholic Church is invited. Please call the Church office.

SACRAMENTS OF VOCATION

Priesthood/Permanent Deaconate – Men who feel that they may be being called to the vocational life of Priesthood or Deaconate can contact the pastor at any time or call the Diocesan Vocation Office at 814-824-1111.

Matrimony – There is a required preparation process which normally includes 3 sessions with the pastor and an Engagement Encounter or Nova experience. Please notify the pastor at least 6 months prior to the anticipated date of marriage.

SACRAMENTS OF HEALING

Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick—Celebrated for all who are seriously ill annually at a parish Liturgy. The Sacrament is also available upon request.

Reconciliation – The sacrament is celebrated weekly on Saturday from 4:45 – 5:15 p.m, or anytime by request. Parish Penance services are celebrated during Advent and Lent. Children preparing for Reconciliation (Gr. 2) and who are active in the Faith Formation process (including Catholic School children) are eligible to enter the sacramental preparation sessions.
