Child Protection and Creating Safe Environments -Bullying Prevention Month: Relational bullying is unwarranted, persistent, unwelcome behavior in the form of criticism, isolation, or fabricated allegations that can damage relationships. Examples include social exclusion ("You can't be with us"), spreading rumors ("Did you hear...?"), and withholding friendship ("I won't be your friend if you..."). Though relational bullying can often seem ambiguous to outside observers and often garners less attention than physical bullying or verbal bullying, it should not be discounted simply as normal, adolescent behavior. In fact, several recent studies suggest relational bullying is more strongly related to emotional distress and teen depression than any other form of bullying. Our Eternal Shepherd and Holy Saints in Heaven

We are very familiar with the opening verses of Psalm 23:1-3a that states: "The Lord is my Shepherd: I shall not want. In verdant pastures He gives me repose; beside restful waters He leads me; He refreshes my soul."

We have most likely heard these sacred words proclaimed during a funeral or possibly at a day of reflection at a retreat center. The very consoling meaning of these words can touch the most delicate and deepest areas of our heart and soul. OK. What are these words saying to us in our lives right now?

When David and the community of Israel wrote the words "The Lord is my Shepherd, I shall not want," they were saying 'God is my good Shepherd protecting me from harm and fulfilling my basic needs to the point where I don't have to ask constantly for what I want everyday.' A good question for us is *Do I believe Jesus our Eternal Good Shepherd is taking care of me during this time of the COVID-pandemic?*

The next words of the verse are "In verdant pastures He gives me repose; beside restful waters He leads me; He refreshes my soul." After a busy, stressful day at work or watching more negative news on TV or on social media, can I say without a doubt that Jesus my Lord will give me peace and refresh my soul after I have spent some good time in prayer?

I hope we are able to say 'yes' to the above questions. Holy saints who have said 'yes' to God's invitation to trust and to let Him take care of them are Mary the Blessed Mother, Our Lady of the Holy Rosary, and St. Teresa of Avila.

October is the month of the Holy Rosary. A special feast day entitled "Our Lady of the Rosary" is celebrated every October 7th. On October 13th we celebrate the final apparition of our Blessed Mother at Fatima in 1917 when the miracle of the sun took place in the sky. Truly, the message at Fatima to pray the Rosary, to go to Confession, and to pray for the conversion of sinners needs to be the first priority for the Church. If we do this, outstanding miracles will happen all over, and there will be peace in our world.

SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION

Baptism – A baptism preparation session is required of all parents wishing to have their child(ren) baptized. Parents must be registered parishioners. Sessions are held periodically at parishes throughout the Deanery. It is always preferred that baptisms be celebrated during a regular Sunday Liturgy. Call the Parish office for more information.

Eucharist - Children preparing for Eucharist (Gr. 3) and who are active in the Faith Formation process (including Catholic School children) are eligible to enter the sacramental preparation sessions.

Confirmation – High School youth who are entering the 11th grade and who are active in the Faith Formation process or attend a Catholic High School since 9th grade are eligible to enter the Confirmation preparation sessions.

R.C.I.A. – Rite of Christian Initiation for adults are initiated into the Church through this process. Any individual who may be interested in becoming a member of the Catholic Church is invited. Please call the Church office.

SACRAMENTS OF VOCATION

Priesthood/Permanent Deaconate – Men who feel that they may be being called to the vocational life of Priesthood or Deaconate can contact the pastor at any time or call the Diocesan Vocation Office at 814-824-1111.

Matrimony – There is a required preparation process which normally includes 3 sessions with the pastor and an Engagement Encounter or Nova experience. Please notify the pastor at least 6 months prior to the anticipated date of marriage.

SACRAMENTS OF HEALING

Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick – Is celebrated for all who are seriously ill annually at a parish Liturgy. The Sacrament is also available anytime upon request.

Reconciliation – The sacrament is celebrated weekly on Saturday from 4:45 – 5:15 p.m., or anytime by request. Parish Penance services are celebrated during Advent and Lent. Children preparing for Reconciliation (Gr. 2) and who are active in the Faith Formation process (including Catholic School children) are eligible to enter the sacramental preparation sessions.
