Stories of Resurrection

Bruce was a hard-working person enjoying a lot of time hunting, fishing, canoeing and spending many hours in his "man cave" watching sports on his large screen TV. He and his wife did have friends with whom they would often get together. This socializing is what helped them in their communication with each other. However, they had issues between each other. One of the biggest issues was that his wife wanted him to start going back to Mass with her. He maintained he didn't need to go unless it was a wedding or funeral.

One day he started getting severe pains in his chest. Rushed to the hospital, he underwent a heart catheterization and was told he needed heart surgery immediately. After his successful bypass surgery, he said to his wife, "I'm ready to start going back to Mass with you." She was amazed and asked why. He replied, "The prayers that I prayed after my surgery and during my recovery convinced me that God was with me and healed me and told me to go back to Mass. Bruce's new life with his **resurrected faith** in Jesus began.

Another example of a **resurrection story** is one that many people who had struggled in their education can relate to. The story is of a young boy being attention deficit who went from tutor to tutor and some remedial reading sessions. These efforts helped but it wasn't until he began to believe he had gifts from God that he needed to develop that he started to make a significant change in his life.

With the encouragement of many people, his grades began to improve. He graduated from high school, went to college, then law school and became a very successful lawyer. The affirmation of many people and his belief in God and the need to be diligent in developing his God-given gifts is a unique story. His perseverance in his reading ability was a gradual **resurrection in his learning experience**.

Blessed Chiara Badano was an average teenage girl who lived an ordinary lifestyle with extraordinary faith. Chiara had a love for people. As a child, she gave away her toys to poor children and spent time visiting the elderly in nursing homes. She was a popular student and active in tennis and swimming. Eventually, she was diagnosed with bone cancer and became the source of encouragement and inspiration for those around her in her selfless care and concern for others during her sufferings. An important prayer for her was "For You, Jesus." She died in 1990 at 18 and was beatified in 2010 following a miracle of a boy who was healed from meningitis through her intercessory prayers. We all have a resurrection story. What is yours? Reflect on it this Easter.

BULLETIN INFORMATION

Groups or individuals wishing to have information published in the bulletin are asked to submit the information in writing, by email or by phone by Monday at 10:00 a.m.

SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION

Baptism – A baptism preparation session is required of all parents wishing to have their child(ren) baptized. Parents must be registered parishioners. Sessions are held periodically at parishes throughout the Deanery. It is always preferred that baptisms be celebrated during a regular Sunday Liturgy. Call the Parish office for more information.

Eucharist – Children preparing for Eucharist (Gr. 3) and who are active in the Faith Formation process (including Catholic School children) are eligible to enter the sacramental preparation sessions.

Confirmation – High School youth who are entering the 11th grade and who are active in the Faith Formation process or attend a Catholic High School since 9th grade are eligible to enter the Confirmation preparation sessions.

R.C.I.A. – Rite of Christian Initiation for adults are initiated into the Church through this process. Any individual who may be interested in becoming a member of the Catholic Church is invited. Please call the Church office.

SACRAMENTS OF VOCATION

Priesthood/Permanent Deaconate - Men who feel that they may be being called to the vocational life of Priesthood or Deaconate can contact the pastor at any time or call the Diocesan Vocation Office at 814-824-1111.

Matrimony – There is a required preparation process which normally includes 3 sessions with the pastor and an Engagement Encounter or Nova experience. Please notify the pastor at least 6 months prior to the anticipated date of marriage. SACRAMENTS OF HEALING

Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick-Celebrated for all who are seriously ill annually at a parish Liturgy. The Sacrament is also available upon request.

Reconciliation – The sacrament is celebrated weekly on Saturday from 4:45 – 5:15 p.m., or anytime by request. Parish Penance services are celebrated during Advent and Lent. Children preparing for Reconciliation (Gr. 2) and who are active in the Faith Formation process (including Catholic School children) are eligible to enter the sacramental preparation sessions. .
