## The Preface Prayer of Giving Thanks The Acclamation — Holy, Holy, Holy

The final part of the Preface Prayer is an expression of giving thanks as the Roman Missal Mass Book says —"in which the priest, in the name of the whole of the holy people, glorifies God the Father and gives thanks to Him for the whole work of salvation or for some particular aspect of it, according to the varying day, festivity or time of year." (Roman Missal, page 36, No. 79) There are many *Preface Prayers* such as the basic preface in the Roman Missal used during the Ordinary Time of the Year which starts out: "It is truly right and just, our duty and our salvation, always and everywhere to give You thanks, Father Most Holy, through Your Beloved Son, Jesus Christ, Your Word through Whom You made all things ...)

The other *Preface Prayers* will have the same introduction of thanksgiving and then will continue as the following *Preface* used during the Season of Lent: "...For by Your Gracious Gift each year Your faithful await the Sacred Paschal Feasts with the joy of minds made pure..." (Roman Missal, page 546) In addition, there are *Preface Prayers* for feast days of the saints - "For in the marvelous confession of Your Saints, You make Your Church fruitful with strength ever new and offer us sure signs of Your Love..." (Roman Missal, page 600) The words of the Preface Prayer reflect on God's marvelous deed to His people Israel up to our time today. It then concludes with more words of thanksgiving that leads us into the Holy,

Holy, Holy Acclamation.

The words of the **Acclamation** is praise that we either recite or sing at Mass. These words "Holy, Holy, Holy Lord God of hosts, heaven and earth are full of Your Glory, Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is He Who comes in the Name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest." These words are sung by the Angels in Heaven as described by the prophet Isaiah in his sixth chapter. Dr. Ed Sri explains it this way: "Isaiah reports that he saw 'the Lord sitting upon a throne, high and lifted up and His train filled the temple.' (Isaiah 6:1) Above the Lord are the six-winged angelic seraphim which means 'burning ones' in Hebrew. This unique title suggests that these angels are close to God and they reflect His Radiance. Yet, even these angelic beings stand in utter awe before the divine presence. They cover their faces, daring not to behold the full glory of God and they call to one another in an ecstatic hymn of praise: 'Holy, Holy, Holy is the Lord of hosts, the whole earth is full of His Glory." (Isaiah 6:2-3) (Dr. Ed Sri, The Mass, pages 125-126)

When we sing the "Holy, Holy," we are like the holy Angels in Heaven. Amen to that!

#### SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION

Baptism – A baptism preparation session is required of all parents wishing to have their child(ren) baptized. Parents must be registered parishioners. Sessions are held periodically at parishes throughout the Deanery. It is always preferred that baptisms be celebrated during a regular Sunday Liturgy. Call the Parish office for more information.

Eucharist – Children preparing for Eucharist (Gr. 3) and who are active in the Faith Formation process (including Catholic School children) are eligible to enter the sacramental preparation sessions.

**Confirmation** – High School youth who are entering the 11<sup>th</sup> grade and who are active in the Faith Formation process or attend a Catholic High School since 9th grade are eligible to enter the Confirmation preparation sessions.

R.C.I.A. – Rite of Christian Initiation for adults are initiated into the Church through this process. Any individual who may be interested in becoming a member of the Catholic Church is invited. Please call the Church office.

#### SACRAMENTS OF VOCATION

Priesthood/Permanent Deaconate – Men who feel that they may be being called to the vocational life of Priesthood or Deaconate can contact the pastor at any time or call the Diocesan Vocation Office at 814-824-1111.

Matrimony – There is a required preparation process which normally includes 3 sessions with the pastor and an Engagement Encounter or Nova experience. Please notify the pastor at least 6 months prior to the anticipated date of marriage.

## SACRAMENTS OF HEALING

Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick-Celebrated for all who are seriously ill annually at a parish Liturgy. The Sacrament is also available upon

Reconciliation – The sacrament is celebrated weekly on Saturday from 4:45 – 5:15 p.m, or anytime by request. Parish Penance services are celebrated during Advent and Lent. Children preparing for Reconciliation (Gr. 2) and who are active in the Faith Formation process (including Catholic School children) are eligible to enter the sacramental preparation sessions.
