The Preparation of the Gifts

After the Liturgy of the Word, we entered into the Liturgy of the Eucharist. The three main parts of the Liturgy of the Eucharist are the **Preparation of the** Gifts, the Eucharistic Prayer and the Communion Rite. We first look at the Preparation of the Gifts.

The **Preparation of the Gifts** goes back to the 2nd Century of Christianity. Saint Justin, martyr, explains the Mass and is quoted in the Catechism of the Church of his words written to the pagan emperor Antoninus Pius around the year 155 AD. (CCC 1345)

"On the day we call the day of the sun, all who dwell in the city or country gather in the same place. The memoirs of the apostles and the writings of the prophets are read, as much as time permits. When the reader has finished, he who presides over those gathered admonishes and challenges them to imitate these beautiful things. Then we all rise together and offer prayers for ourselves and for all others, wherever they may be, so that we may be found righteous by our life and actions and faithful to the commandments, so as to obtain eternal salvation. When the prayers are concluded we exchange the kiss of peace. **Then** someone brings bread and a cup of water and wine mixed together to him who presides over the **brethren.** He takes them and offers praise and glory to the Father of the universe, through the name of the Son and of the Holy Spirit and for a considerable time he gives thanks (in Greek: eucharistian) that we have been judged worthy of these gifts. When he has concluded the prayers and thanksgivings, all present give voice to an acclamation by saying: 'Amen.' When he who presides has given thanks and the people have responded, those whom we call deacons give to those present the "eucharisted" bread, wine and water and take them to those who are absent."

What we have just read is the order of the Mass that we celebrate today. Our experience of the Preparation of the Gifts is that as the bread and wine are being brought to the table to be offered up, we are bringing ourselves spiritually to this same table (the Altar) to offer up our hopes, our prayers and our very lives to the Lord for Him to transform our own lives into a holy people He calls us to be.

This is the Grace given from the Holy Eucharist. God Bless. Father Mark

SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION

Baptism – A baptism preparation session is required of all parents wishing to have their child(ren) baptized. Parents must be registered parishioners. Sessions are held periodically at parishes throughout the Deanery. It is always preferred that baptisms be celebrated during a regular Sunday Liturgy. Call the Parish office for more information.

Eucharist – Children preparing for Eucharist (Gr. 3) and who are active in the Faith Formation process (including Catholic School children) are eligible to enter the sacramental preparation sessions.

Confirmation – High School youth who are entering the 11th grade and who are active in the Faith Formation process or attend a Catholic High School since 9th grade are eligible to enter the Confirmation preparation sessions.

R.C.I.A. - Rite of Christian Initiation for adults are initiated into the Church through this process. Any individual who may be interested in becoming a member of the Catholic Church is invited. Please call the Church office.

SACRAMENTS OF VOCATION

Priesthood/Permanent Deaconate – Men who feel that they may be being called to the vocational life of Priesthood or Deaconate can contact the pastor at any time or call the Diocesan Vocation Office at 814-824-1111.

Matrimony – There is a required preparation process which normally includes 3 sessions with the pastor and an Engagement Encounter or Nova experience. Please notify the pastor at least 6 months prior to the anticipated date of marriage.

SÁCRAMENTS OF HEALING

Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick-Celebrated for all who are seriously ill annually at a parish Liturgy. The Sacrament is also available upon

Reconciliation – The sacrament is celebrated weekly on Saturday from 4:45 – 5:15 p.m, or anytime by request. Parish Penance services are celebrated during Advent and Lent. Children preparing for Reconciliation (Gr. 2) and who are active in the Faith Formation process (including Catholic School children) are eligible to enter the sacramental preparation sessions.
