Gaudete Sunday (Third Sunday of Advent)

If you or I could change our world and make it better where everyone is respected and love one another where all people's needs would be fulfilled, what would we do to bring about these changes? In our First Reading Isaiah describes to God's people what His plans are to make things better for them. God would start with the land turning their desert into gardens bursting with vegetation, abundant flowers, etc. as if it were singing a joyful song. This is part of the Glory of God.

Then, Isaiah says that the Messiah will come and bring healing to the blind, deaf and lame. The Psalm even gives praise to God for His Faithfulness and adds to Isaiah's list by mentioning the hungry, the oppressed, the orphans and the widows who will be helped and protected by the Lord.

In our Gospel Reading Jesus tells the disciples of John the Baptist "go tell John what you hear and see" (Mt 11: 4) Isaiah's prophesies are now being fulfilled — The Messiah is in our midst. What joy that must have brought John the Baptist! My brothers and sisters, what joy it brings to us today! The Messiah, Emmanuel Jesus is in our midst. That's why we celebrate this Third Sunday of Advent — a joyful Sunday — Gaudet Sunday. We light the rose candle and we wear rose-colored vestments to express joy.

How is the Messiah in our midst? His Words of Hope in the Bible. Whether spoken or through the use of social media, your words of hope to people who are feeling sad during these days leading up to Christmas are because Jesus is working through you. Our actions of kindness in helping one another in need is a tremendous support whether it is a typical daily activity or a more involved emotional and stressful situation. This attitude of joy is what can help make this world a better and more joyful place of welcoming and forgiveness. Remember, Jesus is in God Bless. Father Mark our midst.

BULLETIN INFORMATION

Groups or individuals wishing to have information published in the bulletin are asked to submit the information in writing, by email or by phone by Monday at 10:00 a.m.

SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION

Baptism – A baptism preparation session is required of all parents wishing to have their child(ren) baptized. Parents must be registered parishioners. Sessions are held periodically at parishes throughout the Deanery. It is always preferred that baptisms be celebrated during a regular Sunday Liturgy. Call the Parish office for more information.

Eucharist – Children preparing for Eucharist (Gr. 3) and who are active in the Faith Formation process (including Catholic School children) are eligible to enter the sacramental preparation sessions.

Confirmation – High School youth who are entering the 11th grade and who are active in the Faith Formation process or attend a Catholic High School since 9th grade are eligible to enter the Confirmation preparation sessions.

R.C.I.A. – Rite of Christian Initiation for adults are initiated into the Church through this process. Any individual who may be interested in becoming a member of the Catholic Church is invited. Please call the Church office.

SACRAMENTS OF VOCATION

Priesthood/Permanent Deaconate – Men who feel that they may be being called to the vocational life of Priesthood or Deaconate can contact the pastor at any time or call the Diocesan Vocation Office at 814-824-1111.

Matrimony – There is a required preparation process which normally includes 3 sessions with the pastor and an Engagement Encounter or Nova experience. Please notify the pastor at least 6 months prior to the anticipated date of marriage.

SACRAMENTS OF HEALING

Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick—Celebrated for all who are seriously ill annually at a parish Liturgy. The Sacrament is also available upon request.

Reconciliation – The sacrament is celebrated weekly on Saturday from 4:45 – 5:15 p.m, or anytime by request. Parish Penance services are celebrated during Advent and Lent. Children preparing for Reconciliation (Gr. 2) and who are active in the Faith Formation process (including Catholic School children) are eligible to enter the sacramental preparation sessions.
