Child Protection and Creating Safe Environments – January is Human Trafficking Prevention Month. Child Sex Trafficking is a form of child abuse that occurs when any child under age 18 is advertised, solicited, or exploited through a commercial sex act where sex is traded for money, food, shelter, drugs, or anything of value. Traffickers can be anyone including friends, gangs, family members, foster parents, perceived trusted adults or boyfriends. Talk to your child openly about this reality and build resiliency. Address the myths and misconceptions that glamorize the commercial sex industry. Social media and gaming platforms are increasingly becoming the tool traffickers and other predators use to target, groom, and recruit victims. At some point your child will likely be confronted with inappropriate messages or see things online that they know are wrong. Teach your child how to handle these situations. EPIPHANYThe Diligence of the Magi

The most inspiring lesson that the Magi (The Three Kings) can give to us during this Feast of the Epiphany of the Lord is their diligent, persistent spirit in traveling almost 1,000 miles in search of the "newborn King of the Jews." (Mt. 2: 2) It simply says they were from the East and they used the night stars as their compass that led them to Jerusalem. Once there, they asked for further directions and said; "we saw His Star at it's rising and have come to do Him homage." (Mt 2: 2)

After King Herod got instructions from the chief priests as to where the Christ was to be born, he sent the Magi "to Bethlehem and said; 'go and search diligently for the child. When you have found Him, bring me word that I, too, may go and do Him homage.' "(Mt 2: 8) Of course, as we all know, Herod had no intention to offer homage to the Christ child. But, the Magi on the other hand, "were overjoyed at seeing the star and on entering the house they saw the child with Mary, His Mother." (Mt 2: 10-11) Their diligent search for the Christ child was completed. They then knelt down and offered the most precious gifts to the Baby Jesus: Gold, Frankincense, and Myrrh. Their act of homage was their greatest gift.

My friends, as we conclude the Christmas Season this coming week, may each of us ask ourselves; Were we searching for something from Jesus during this Christmas Season? Did we find Who we were diligently searching for? May we say Yes, I've found Christ as the Magi did. And to say, I've found Christ in another person, in myself, and at Mass, during this Holy Season.

SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION

Baptism – A baptism preparation session is required of all parents wishing to have their child(ren) baptized. Parents must be registered parishioners. Sessions are held periodically at parishes throughout the Deanery. It is always preferred that baptisms be celebrated during a regular Sunday Liturgy. Call the Parish office for more information.

Eucharist – Children preparing for Eucharist (Gr. 3) and who are active in the Faith Formation process (including Catholic School children) are eligible to enter the sacramental preparation sessions.

Confirmation – High School youth who are entering the 9th grade and who are active in the Faith Formation process or attend a Catholic High School are eligible to enter the Confirmation preparation sessions.

R.C.I.A. – Rite of Christian Initiation for adults are initiated into the Church through this process. Any individual who may be interested in becoming a member of the Catholic Church is invited. Please call the Church office.

SACRAMENTS OF VOCATION

Priesthood/Permanent Deaconate – Men who feel that they may be being called to the vocational life of Priesthood or Deaconate can contact the pastor at any time or call the Diocesan Vocation Office at 814-824-1111.

Matrimony – There is a required preparation process which normally includes 3 sessions with the pastor and an Engagement Encounter or Nova experience. Please notify the pastor at least 6 months prior to the anticipated date of marriage.
