Child Protection and Creating Safe Environments- Teaching Kids to Be Smart About Social Media: There are plenty of good things about social media – but also many risks and things kids and teens should avoid. To help your child find the balance, it's important to talk with your kids about how to use social media wisely. Emphasis to your child that it's important to: 1.) Be nice. Mean behavior is not OK. 2.) Think twice before hitting "enter". Remind them that what they post can be used against them. 3.) Use privacy settings. 4.) Don't "friend" strangers. If you don't know them, don't friend them. 5.) Teach kids not to share anything on social media that they wouldn't want their teachers, college admissions officers, future bosses – and even gramma – to see. The Examen During Advent

As we begin this Holy Season of Advent, the Scriptures help us to be consciously aware of some special ways God is working in our lives. God will take the initiative to show us personally, but we must strive to watch for it so we can recognize God's action. The Gospel says quite clearly to "Be watchful! Be Alert! You do not know when the time will come." (Mark 13:33)

St. Ignatius of Loyola can help us be aware of God's Presence and Action in our lives with the prayer practice called the *Examen*. This is simply to take ten to fifteen minutes toward the end of the day to review and reflect on ways God was helping you understand His Activity in our lives. It might be about a complex issue that you worked through and was easily resolved. It may be a new insight into your faith. But, it can also be an affirming complement from another person, the amazement of a new talent or ability you've discovered, or the lyrics and melody of a new song you heard that lifted your spirits. Once you can identify something of God during your day, then proceed with the following steps as much as time allows...

Thanksgiving: Identify the actual blessing you have received from God and say in prayer: 'Thank You, God.'

Light: Pray to be able to see the truth of yourself as God sees you.

Review of the Day: As you look at how things went in your life this day, ask yourself; What was the one thing or event that stands out most? What are your thoughts and feelings about that moment of reflection?


Response: In response to the above questions, was it something positive or negative? Were there both positive and negative events that occurred that day?

Action: If the event or experience was not good or wrong, then plan how to correct it for the next day. If the events or the experiences that day are good, positive and joyful events, attitudes, or situations that went well, then decide how it can be repeated for the next day. Conclude with an *Our Father*.

Advent is a season of *hope and joy*.

Let's watch for it!

BULLETIN INFORMATION

Groups or individuals wishing to have information published in the bulletin are asked to submit the information in writing, by email or by phone by **Monday** at **10:00 a.m**.

SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION

Baptism – A baptism preparation session is required of all parents wishing to have their child(ren) baptized. Parents must be registered parishioners. Sessions are held periodically at parishes throughout the Deanery. It is always preferred that baptisms be celebrated during a regular Sunday Liturgy. Call the Parish office for more information.

Eucharist – Children preparing for Eucharist (Gr. 3) and who are active in the Faith Formation process (including Catholic School children) are eligible to enter the sacramental preparation sessions.

Confirmation – High School youth who are entering the 9th grade and who are active in the Faith Formation process or attend a Catholic High School are eligible to enter the Confirmation preparation sessions.

R.C.I.A. – Rite of Christian Initiation for adults are initiated into the Church through this process. Any individual who may be interested in becoming a member of the Catholic Church is invited. Please call the Church office.

SACRAMENTS OF VOCATION

Priesthood/Permanent Deaconate – Men who feel that they may be being called to the vocational life of Priesthood or Deaconate can contact the pastor at any time or call the Diocesan Vocation Office at 814-824-1111.

Matrimony – There is a required preparation process which normally includes 3 sessions with the pastor and an Engagement Encounter or Nova experience. Please notify the pastor at least 6 months prior to the anticipated date of marriage.
