



## Live the Works of Mercy

My friends, as we celebrate this weekend of Divine Mercy Sunday, it is a great opportunity to experience Jesus's Mercy in our lives. It is important to pray the Divine Mercy Novena. Also, pray the Chaplet of Divine Mercy everyday. In addition, we can experience God's Mercy by confessing our sins to God in the Sacrament of Confession and by forgiving others, reading the Bible, and telling Jesus how you feel and what's on your mind. As we experience God's loving Mercy, then we share that Mercy with others. The following are the *Works of Mercy* and some ways that will help us to live them...

## **Corporal Works of Mercy**

1. Feed the Hungry. Contribute to the Christian Food Bank box in the Church.

2. Give drink to the Thirsty. Always have enough water on hand to give to any anyone. Often times people are thirsty spiritually for a kind word.

3. Clothe the Naked. Contribute to the Guardian Angel Center in Kersey.

4. Visit the Imprisoned. If possible, visit someone you know in prison or someone confined to their home, or just send a card.

5. Shelter the Homeless. Send a contribution to an organization committed to this cause.

6. Visit the Sick. When possible, visit those in hospitals, in nursing homes or at their home.

7. Bury the Dead. Having a funeral Mass in Church, or a service of the Word in a funeral home or at the cemetery are the best ways to honor those who have died.

#### **Spiritual Works of Mercy**

1. Counsel the Doubtful. Always be willing to share your belief and trust in God to someone who is doubting God.

2. Instruct the Ignorant. Give good thoughtful direction to those who are uninformed about human and spiritual truths.

3. Admonish Sinners. Gently tell someone their fault with the hope of teaching them. Do this out of love and never out of envy or anger.

4.Comfort the Afflicted. Always have a listening ear to someone in pain, sorrow or anxiety. Be willing to pray with them.

5. Forgive Offenses. It is not always easy but at least have a desire to forgive and give the situation to God, pray and let Him take over.

6. Bear Wrongs Patiently. Be patient and forgiving toward yourself when you are wrong and be willing to do this for others.

7. Pray for the Living and the Dead because those in Purgatory need your prayers as we need each others' prayers to survive this life.

#### SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION

Baptism - A baptism preparation session is required of all parents wishing to have their child(ren) baptized. Parents must be registered parishioners. Sessions are held periodically at parishes throughout the Deanery. It is always preferred that baptisms be celebrated during a regular Sunday Liturgy. Call the Parish office for more information.

Eucharist - Children preparing for Eucharist (Gr. 3) and who are active in the Faith Formation process (including Catholic School children) are eligible to enter the sacramental preparation sessions.

Confirmation - High School youth who are entering the 11th grade and who are active in the Faith Formation process or attend a Catholic High School since 9th grade are eligible to enter the Confirmation preparation sessions.

R.C.I.A. – Rite of Christian Initiation for adults are initiated into the Church through this process. Any individual who may be interested in becoming a member of the Catholic Church is invited. Please call the Church office.

SACRAMENTS OF VOCATION

Priesthood/Permanent Deaconate – Men who feel that they may be being called to the vocational life of Priesthood or Deaconate can contact the pastor at any time or call the Diocesan Vocation Office at 814-824-1111.

Matrimony – There is a required preparation process which normally includes 3 sessions with the pastor and an Engagement Encounter or Nova experience. Please notify the pastor at least 6 months prior to the anticipated date of marriage.

SACRAMENTS OF HEALING

Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick-Celebrated for all who are seriously ill annually at a parish Liturgy. The Sacrament is also available upon request. Reconciliation – The sacrament is celebrated weekly on Saturday from 4:45 – 5:15 p.m. or anytime by request. Parish Penance services are celebrated during Advent and Lent. Children preparing for Reconciliation (Gr. 2) and who are active in the Faith Formation process (including Catholic School children) are eligible to enter the sacramental preparation sessions.
