Sharing Our Faith Series

Scripture: First Reading at Mass Genesis 2:18-24

In this part of the story of creation the animals and man have been created, "man gave names to all the cattle..."(Gen 2:20a) As we read that none of the animals "proved to be a suitable partner for the man" (Gen 2:20b). In the next scene, as the man is asleep, God "took out one of His ribs and closed it up its place with flesh. The Lord God then built up into a woman the rib that He had taken from the man." (Gen 2:21-22)) Very simply put, this new human being is united to man in the likeness they share. This likeness is further made ever new when these two human beings are united in the Sacrament of Matrimony and become one flesh. This Sacrament can and does enable man and woman to be more bonded to each other.

-Isn't this what married couples want? —Isn't this what we want for them?

Psalm: 128:1-2, 3, 4-5, 6

This Psalm is a prayer of blessing: "Blessed are you who fear the Lord and walk in His ways." (Ps 128:1) The wife, husband, and children are blessed. The Lord blesses you from Zion — may you see the prosperity of Jerusalem all the days of your life.

—Do you believe that you and your family are blessed by God? Ok. Now, make a list of your blessings, then thank God for each of them.

Scripture: Second Reading at Mass **Hebrews 2:9-11**

This Reading may draw us more closely to the humanity of Christ our Lord with the following words: "He (meaning Jesus) for a little while was made lower than the angels, that by the grace of God He might taste death for everyone." (Heb 2:9)

—We thank Jesus for dying on the cross for our salvation and rising again for us also to share in His Resurrection.

Gospel Reading at Mass: Mark 10:2-16

"The Pharisees approached Jesus and asked, 'Is it lawful for a husband to divorce his wife?"" (Mk 10:2) A very sensitive issue in this day and age. A useful question here is about first-marriage couples and divorced and remarried couples whose marriage was blessed in the Church which needs to be asked:

-What can we do as a couple to strengthen and to affirm this marriage or in some cases to salvage this marriage? Pray together and talk things out. "A family who prays together, stays together" (saying by Father Payton)

-Are you striving to do this?

SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION

Baptism - A baptism preparation session is required of all parents wishing to have their child(ren) baptized. Parents must be registered parishioners. Sessions are held periodically at parishes throughout the Deanery. It is always preferred that baptisms be celebrated during a regular Sunday Liturgy. Call the Parish office for more information.

Eucharist - Children preparing for Eucharist (Gr. 3) and who are active in the Faith Formation process (including Catholic School children) are eligible to enter the sacramental preparation sessions.

Confirmation – High School youth who are entering the 11th grade and who are active in the Faith Formation process or attend a Catholic High School since 9th grade are eligible to enter the Confirmation preparation sessions.

R.C.I.A. - Rite of Christian Initiation for adults are initiated into the Church through this process. Any individual who may be interested in becoming a member of the Catholic Church is invited. Please call the Church office.

SACRAMENTS OF VOCATION

Priesthood/Permanent Deaconate – Men who feel that they may be being called to the vocational life of Priesthood or Deaconate can contact the pastor at any time or call the Diocesan Vocation Office at 814-824-1111.

Matrimony – There is a required preparation process which normally includes 3 sessions with the pastor and an Engagement Encounter or Nova experience. Please notify the pastor at least 6 months prior to the anticipated date of marriage.

SACRAMÉNTS OF HEALING

Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick-Celebrated for all who are seriously ill annually at a parish Liturgy. The Sacrament is also available upon request. Reconciliation - The sacrament is celebrated weekly on Saturday from 4:45 - 5:15 p.m, or anytime by request. Parish Penance services are celebrated during Advent and Lent. Children preparing for Reconciliation (Gr. 2) and who are active in the Faith Formation process (including Catholic School children) are eligible to enter the sacramental preparation sessions.
