Coming Together and Celebrating

We all come together and celebrate significant events throughout the year especially during the holidays. This special time of the year many people come together to celebrate graduations, weddings, anniversaries and family reunions. Most often our continual celebrations and gathering may happen once a week for a large dinner at grandma and grandpa's house, and of course, special gatherings for annual birthday parties. Celebrating together at these kinds of gatherings were happy and joyful times.

Coming together and being ready to celebrate Jesus's gifts to each of us is the emphasis of our Second Reading from the Book of Revelation in this Sunday's Readings. The Apostle John writes the Words of Jesus's Message to His loved ones, His Bride the Church. The word *come (coming)* is used six times in this Reading: "Behold, I am *coming* soon." (Rev 22:12c and again towards the end of the passage when Jesus says: "The Spirit and the Bride say, *'Come'*. Let the hearer say, *'Come.*' Let the one Who thirsts *come* forward and the one who wants it receive the gift of life-giving water. The One Who gives this testimony says, 'Yes, I am *coming* soon: Amen! *Come*, Lord Jesus."" (Rev 22:17, 20)

In these final words of the whole Book of Revelation, Jesus invites those who have believed in His Message and have lived Jesus's Message by their deeds to come together and to receive these eternal gifts which is everlasting life.

Finally, at the Last Supper Jesus prays to God the Father that the Apostles would come together as one and always strive for unity among each other "... that they may be one, as we are one." (John 17:22)

Coming together can always be an opportunity of having good fellowship, sharing a meal, but especially responding to Jesus's invitation of being united together by God's Love. Ask yourself at your next gathering: In what ways is Jesus inviting us to be more united; more forgiving, more loving and more open to being one? And then at Mass pray: Jesus help us to be more patient, and kind. Help us to come together in unity.

SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION

Baptism – A baptism preparation session is required of all parents wishing to have their child(ren) baptized. Parents must be registered parishioners. Sessions are held periodically at parishes throughout the Deanery. It is always preferred that baptisms be celebrated during a regular Sunday Liturgy. Call the Parish office for more information.

Eucharist – Children preparing for Eucharist (Gr. 3) and who are active in the Faith Formation process (including Catholic School children) are eligible to enter the sacramental preparation sessions.

Confirmation – High School youth who are entering the 11th grade and who are active in the Faith Formation process or attend a Catholic High School since 9th grade are eligible to enter the Confirmation preparation sessions.

R.C.I.A. – Rite of Christian Initiation for adults are initiated into the Church through this process. Any individual who may be interested in becoming a member of the Catholic Church is invited. Please call the Church office.

SACRAMENTS OF VOCATION

Priesthood/Permanent Deaconate – Men who feel that they may be being called to the vocational life of Priesthood or Deaconate can contact the pastor at any time or call the Diocesan Vocation Office at 814-824-1111.

Matrimony – There is a required preparation process which normally includes 3 sessions with the pastor and an Engagement Encounter or Nova experience. Please notify the pastor at least 6 months prior to the anticipated date of marriage.

SACRAMENTS OF HEALING

Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick-Celebrated for all who are seriously ill annually at a parish Liturgy. The Sacrament is also available upon request.

Reconciliation – The sacrament is celebrated weekly on Saturday from 4:45 – 5:15 p.m, or anytime by request. Parish Penance services are celebrated during Advent and Lent. Children preparing for Reconciliation (Gr. 2) and who are active in the Faith Formation process (including Catholic School children) are eligible to enter the sacramental preparation sessions.
