He Chose the Nails

For this Lenten Season St. Joseph Church is offering six weeks of Adult Faith Formation study/ discussion sessions similar in focus to what was experienced during Advent but focused on Lent. As you go forth in these study/discussion sessions, you will find that **Jesus did it all just for us**.

You may choose to participate in one of the two sessions each of the six weeks beginning Monday, February 27 after 8:30 a.m. Mass with Father Mark or Wednesday, March 1 after the 6:00 p.m. Stations of the Cross with Deacon Paul. Each week's sessions will be on Mondays and Wednesdays at the above given times. Final session will be Wednesday, April 5. All sessions will be held in the social hall.

Join us to experience **Lent** as a time not to just give up something, but to prepare to receive good blessings from God.

Blessing of the Throat will be at both Masses next weekend February 4 and 5.

Jesus's Homilies

Last week I shared with you the purpose of the **Homilies** and the work of the bishop, priest, and deacon to preach the Word of God especially to make the Gospel relate to everyday lives of people. I concluded this lesson about homilies by explaining how Jesus Himself preached and the methods He used to teach about the Kingdom of God.

Many of Jesus's Homilies are called parables. One such parable is the Parable of the Sower. In this parable "story," Jesus describes a sower (farmer)) who went out to spread and toss seeds on the ground in order for the wheat to grow. The seed was good but the different places it fell were both good, fertile ground and bad, rocky ground with thorns. In the end Jesus explained the parable by saying that the seed is God's Word to us. We are either like the bad ground that closes off the seed, or the good soil that absorbs the good seed in order to produce the good wheat of Blessings and Goodness in our life. (Luke 8:4-15)

Jesus also used current events in order to drive home a point. For example, in one of the times as Jesus was preaching, His Mother Mary and His "brothers" come to where He was but they were unable to join Jesus. The event went as follows: "He was told, 'Your Mother and your brothers are standing outside and they wish to see you.' He said to them in reply, 'My Mother and My brothers are those who hear the Word of God and act on it."" (Luke 8:20-21)

This sudden, unannounced visit of Jesus's family caused our Lord to wisely include everyone present, listeners, and family members to all be considered as spiritual family of Jesus because they were both there to listen to His Word. Jesus's short Homily was to affirm that each group is His Family because they hear God's Word and they act on it.

Finally, what we have in the Gospel Reading this weekend is one of Jesus's most famous **Homilies**— *The Sermon on the Mount*. The preaching style Jesus used here is that He takes a negative or needy life condition such as "poor in spirit" and "they who mourn," or "blessed are the merciful." (Mt 5:3-4, 7) He explained that these needs can be avenues to discover and pray for the opposite positive human fulfillment as the richness of God's Kingdom can give affirmation to those poor in spirit and those who mourn will be comforted. Also, those who show mercy to others will be shown mercy to them by our Lord Jesus.

In the Beatitudes Jesus teaches about the Holy Attitude we are to become in our lives. Choose a Beatitude today and pray for the grace to live it.

Groups or individuals wishing to have information published in the bulletin are asked to submit the information in writing, by email or by phone by Monday at 10:00 a.m.

SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION

Baptism – A baptism preparation session is required of all parents wishing to have their child(ren) baptized. Parents must be registered parishioners. Sessions are held periodically at parishes throughout the Deanery. It is always preferred that baptisms be celebrated during a regular Sunday Liturgy. Call the Parish office for more information.

Eucharist – Children preparing for Eucharist (Gr. 3) and who are active in the Faith Formation process (including Catholic School children) are eligible to enter the sacramental preparation sessions.

Confirmation – High School youth who are entering the 11th grade and who are active in the Faith Formation process or attend a Catholic High School since 9th grade are eligible to enter the Confirmation preparation sessions.

R.C.I.A. – Rite of Christian Initiation for adults are initiated into the Church through this process. Any individual who may be interested in becoming a member of the Catholic Church is invited. Please call the Church office.

SACRAMENTS OF VOCATION

Priesthood/Permanent Deaconate – Men who feel that they may be being called to the vocational life of Priesthood or Deaconate can contact the pastor at any time or call the Diocesan Vocation Office at 814-824-1111.

Matrimony – There is a required preparation process which normally includes 3 sessions with the pastor and an Engagement Encounter or Nova experience. Please notify the pastor at least 6 months prior to the anticipated date of marriage.

SÁCRAMENTS OF HEALING

Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick—Celebrated for all who are seriously ill annually at a parish Liturgy. The Sacrament is also available upon request.

Reconciliation – The sacrament is celebrated weekly on Saturday from 4:45 – 5:15 p.m, or anytime by request. Parish Penance services are celebrated during Advent and Lent. Children preparing for Reconciliation (Gr. 2) and who are active in the Faith Formation process (including Catholic School children) are eligible to enter the sacramental preparation sessions.
