

Steps of a Good Confession

At this time I share with you the preparation that needs to be done in order to make a good Sacrament of Confession. First, it's important to do an examination of conscience. What are the sins that you have committed? Have you committed any mortal sins like breaking any of the Ten Commandments? Next, ask yourself, have you committed any venial sins like not doing something that you know you should have done?

The next step is to count the number of times you have committed each of the sins you identified. Now, you are ready for the Sacrament of Confession.

As you come into the presence of the priest either face to face or anonymously; behind the screen or off to the side, you bless yourself while saying the words . . .

"Bless me, Father for I have sinned." Then, you tell the priest how long it has been since your last confession.

Then say, "*I have committed the following sins*." Briefly, describe the sins and the number of times it was committed.

After this, the priest may possibly explain to you how to avoid that sin in the future. Then, he will assign you to do a penance. Often, a penance would be a prayer or a devotion you would do immediately following your confession, or sometime soon thereafter. It is a good discipline to conclude the receiving of the Sacrament in a spirit of thanksgiving for God's Mercy.

Next, you will then pray the "Act of Contrition." There are a few new versions today. The one that I learned many years ago is the following: "O my God, I am heartly sorry for having offended You. I detest all my sins because of Thy just punishments. But, most of all because they offend Thee my God, Who art all good and deserving of all my love. I firmly resolve, with the help of Thy Grace, to sin no more and to avoid the near occasion of sin. Amen."

The priest then prays the "Prayer of Absolution" which absolves the person of their sins. "God the Father of mercies, through death and resurrection of His Son has reconciled the world to Himself and sent the Holy Spirit among us for the forgiveness of sin. Through the ministry of the Church may God grant you pardon and peace, and I absolve you from all of

your sins. In the Name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Amen."

SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION

Baptism – A baptism preparation session is required of all parents wishing to have their child(ren) baptized. Parents must be registered parishioners. Sessions are held periodically at parishes throughout the Deanery. It is always preferred that baptisms be celebrated during a regular Sunday Liturgy. Call the Parish office for more information.

Eucharist - Children preparing for Eucharist (Gr. 3) and who are active in the Faith Formation process (including Catholic School children) are eligible to enter the sacramental preparation sessions.

Confirmation – High School youth who are entering the 11th grade and who are active in the Faith Formation process or attend a Catholic High School since 9th grade are eligible to enter the Confirmation preparation sessions.

R.C.I.A. – Rite of Christian Initiation for adults are initiated into the Church through this process. Any individual who may be interested in becoming a member of the Catholic Church is invited. Please call the Church office.

SACRAMENTS OF VOCATION

Priesthood/Permanent Deaconate - Men who feel that they may be being called to the vocational life of Priesthood or Deaconate can contact the pastor at any time or call the Diocesan Vocation Office at 814-824-1111.

Matrimony – There is a required preparation process which normally includes 3 sessions with the pastor and an Engagement Encounter or Nova experience. Please notify the pastor at least 6 months prior to the anticipated date of marriage.

SACRAMENTS OF HEALING

Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick-Celebrated for all who are seriously ill annually at a parish Liturgy. The Sacrament is also available upon request. Reconciliation – The sacrament is celebrated weekly on Saturday from 4:45 – 5:15 p.m, or anytime by request. Parish Penance services are celebrated during Advent and Lent. Children preparing for Reconciliation (Gr. 2) and who are active in the Faith Formation process (including Catholic School children) are eligible to enter the sacramental preparation sessions.
