The Holy Season of Lent has begun and the good news is that Lent is an old English word that means spring. Therefore, this new Lent can be a new springtime for us. In the Rule of St. Benedict, chapter 49 he says that . . . "The life of a monk ought to be a continuous Lent . . . This we can do in a fitting manner by refusing to indulge evil habits and by devoting ourselves to prayer. . . let each one deny himself some food, drink, sleep, needless talking, and look forward to holy Easter with joy and spiritual longing." Though we are not monks, St. Benedict's words can help us. Reading the *Little Black Book* will lift us up spiritually.



Sharing Faith: Saint Katherine Drexel The Universal Prayers at Mass Lent Now

An outstanding American saint whose Feast Day is this week –March 3rd— is Saint Katherine Drexel. Her life story is very interesting.

She was born into a very wealthy family in Philadelphia, PA on November 26, 1858. Her father, Francis Drexel, was an international banker. Her mother. Hannah, died a few weeks after Katherine's birth. As her life went on, her father remarried. Eventually, he and the family became active in reaching out to the poor by distributing food, clothing and money from their own home to many people in need. These kind acts were inspiring to Katherine and helped her grow in her faith in God. As a young adult, she cared for her stepmother who was suffering from a painful terminal cancer—this work of mercy changed her life.

A further conversion happened in her life when she traveled with her family to other states in the West and saw the bad conditions of poverty among the Native Americans. She believed that all people must have the basic essentials of life including an education. This belief and quest led her and her sisters to use their great wealth which they inherited after their father's death to build and establish schools for Native Americans and African Americans in thirteen states and many mission centers as well.

She was able to establish these institutions with the permission of Pope Leo XII as well as starting a religious order of nuns (The Blessed Sacrament Sisters for both Native and African Americans) who were dedicated to this work of mercy. She founded Xavier University in New Orleans and Drexel University in Philadelphia.

BULLETIN INFORMATION

Groups or individuals wishing to have information published in the bulletin are asked to submit the information in writing, by email or by phone by Monday at 10:00 a.m.

SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION

Baptism – A baptism preparation session is required of all parents wishing to have their child(ren) baptized. Parents must be registered parishioners. Sessions are held periodically at parishes throughout the Deanery. It is always preferred that baptisms be celebrated during a regular Sunday Liturgy. Call the Parish office for more information.

Eucharist – Children preparing for Eucharist (Gr. 3) and who are active in the Faith Formation process (including Catholic School children) are eligible to enter the sacramental preparation sessions.

Confirmation – High School youth who are entering the 11th grade and who are active in the Faith Formation process or attend a Catholic High School since 9th grade are eligible to enter the Confirmation preparation sessions.

R.C.I.A. – Rite of Christian Initiation for adults are initiated into the Church through this process. Any individual who may be interested in becoming a member of the Catholic Church is invited. Please call the Church office.

SACRAMENTS OF VOCATION

Priesthood/Permanent Deaconate – Men who feel that they may be being called to the vocational life of Priesthood or Deaconate can contact the pastor at any time or call the Diocesan Vocation Office at 814-824-1111.

Matrimony – There is a required preparation process which normally includes 3 sessions with the pastor and an Engagement Encounter or Nova experience. Please notify the pastor at least 6 months prior to the anticipated date of marriage.

SACRAMENTS OF HEALING

Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick—Celebrated for all who are seriously ill annually at a parish Liturgy. The Sacrament is also available upon request.

Reconciliation – The sacrament is celebrated weekly on Saturday from 4:45 – 5:15 p.m, or anytime by request. Parish Penance services are celebrated during Advent and Lent. Children preparing for Reconciliation (Gr. 2) and who are active in the Faith Formation process (including Catholic School children) are eligible to enter the sacramental preparation sessions.
