We are so blessed in this part of Pennsylvania to be living in Bennetts Valley and enjoying the beautiful mountains all around us. Hiking, camping, and hunting in these woods are very popular throughout the whole year. Being at camp on the mountain can be so relaxing and healing from busy demands of one's job and tensions in life. Being at camp on the mountain can also be an inspiring opportunity for prayer and spiritual reading and as an encounter with God.

Finding God on the mountain is told and read about many times in the Old Testament of the Bible. Moses received the Ten Commandments from God on Mount Sinai. Mount Zion is also mentioned as a place of peace and harmony between animals and people. It is an image of God's Kingdom — a place to encounter God


In a like manner, in our Gospel Reading this weekend, Jesus takes Peter, James and John up a high mountain for some time to pray. What happened during that time was an encounter with God that would affirm Peter, James and John in their faith in Jesus and it would strengthen Jesus to ultimately face His Death and Resurrection.

What was the encounter? Jesus being revealed in His Glory just as it is described: "While He was praying, His Face changed in appearance and His clothing became dazzling white" (Luke 9:29) Also, Jesus's conversation with Moses and Elijah is to indicate that Jesus's Death and Resurrection would fulfill and complete the Law that Moses represented and the prophets that Elijah represented.

My friends, during this Lenten Season go to the place where you will best encounter God in prayer. This place may be on a mountain at camp. But, this place can also simply be that special room in your home where it is quiet with no distractions. One of the best places to encounter our Lord is by making a *visit* to the Blessed Sacrament in the Church.

We, Catholics are familiar with these words to make a *visit* in Church. Jesus is truly present in the Host in the Tabernacle as He patiently waits for us to come into Church and pray and spend our time with Him — our Eucharistic Lord.

BULLETIN INFORMATION

Groups or individuals wishing to have information published in the bulletin are asked to submit the information in writing, by email or by phone by Monday at 10:00 a.m.

SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION

Baptism – A baptism preparation session is required of all parents wishing to have their child(ren) baptized. Parents must be registered parishioners. Sessions are held periodically at parishes throughout the Deanery. It is always preferred that baptisms be celebrated during a regular Sunday Liturgy. Call the Parish office for more information.

Eucharist – Children preparing for Eucharist (Gr. 3) and who are active in the Faith Formation process (including Catholic School children) are eligible to enter the sacramental preparation sessions.

Confirmation – High School youth who are entering the 11th grade and who are active in the Faith Formation process or attend a Catholic High School since 9th grade are eligible to enter the Confirmation preparation sessions.

R.C.I.A. – Rite of Christian Initiation for adults are initiated into the Church through this process. Any individual who may be interested in becoming a member of the Catholic Church is invited. Please call the Church office.

SACRAMENTS OF VOCATION

Priesthood/Permanent Deaconate - Men who feel that they may be being called to the vocational life of Priesthood or Deaconate can contact the pastor at any time or call the Diocesan Vocation Office at 814-824-1111.

Matrimony – There is a required preparation process which normally includes 3 sessions with the pastor and an Engagement Encounter or Nova experience. Please notify the pastor at least 6 months prior to the anticipated date of marriage.

SACRAMENTS OF HEALING

Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick-Celebrated for all who are seriously ill annually at a parish Liturgy. The Sacrament is also available upon

Reconciliation – The sacrament is celebrated weekly on Saturday from 4:45 – 5:15 p.m., or anytime by request. Parish Penance services are celebrated during Advent and Lent. Children preparing for Reconciliation (Gr. 2) and who are active in the Faith Formation process (including Catholic School children) are eligible to enter the sacramental preparation sessions.
