From Fishing to Shepherding

I haven't gone fishing for many years. I know that it is a very popular sport. I do enjoy eating fish especially at our dinners during the Season of Lent. Along with millions of other people, I am very grateful for those who make their living by fishing in order to provide this food for the whole world.

We hear in this weekend's Gospel that Jesus again reveals Himself to His Apostles after His Resurrection. This time Jesus shows up at the shore along the Sea of Tiberias. Several hours before this, Peter had decided to go fishing in late evening with the other Apostles joining Him "but that night they caught nothing." (John 21:3)

At dawn, the Risen Lord was already on the seashore baking fish on an open fire for His Apostles. He told His Apostles to cast their nets on the right side of the boat — the Apostle John recognized it was Jesus. In doing this, they brought in an overwhelming number of large fish — 153! The number of 153 fish symbolizes a large number.

In this chapter from St. John's Gospel, we learn a lot about the Apostle Peter. He is absolutely set on following Jesus. In this story Peter was the first to jump out of the boat and run to Jesus Who was standing on the seashore. The Disciples had breakfast with Jesus— and then the work — the vocation of Peter goes from Fishing to Shepherding.

No longer would Peter need to fish for a living. As we have heard last Sunday in the Acts of the Apostles, Chapter 5 and this Sunday, as well, that Peter's full-time work now would be healing in Jesus's Name and teaching about Jesus as Savior and Lord.

Towards the end of this Sunday's Gospel from John 21, Jesus asks Peter three times "Do you love me?" Peter who denied our Lord three times during His Passion is now so deeply taken by the Risen Lord that his response is "You know that I love You." (John 21:17) Peter then is given the ministry of **shepherding and feeding** God's people with the Word and the Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist.

We are grateful for all the deacons, priests, monsignors, bishops, cardinals and our Holy Father Pope Francis who shepherd our Church today. May we continue to pray for each of them.

Groups or individuals wishing to have information published in the bulletin are asked to submit the information in writing, by email or by phone by Monday at 10:00 a.m.

SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION

Baptism – A baptism preparation session is required of all parents wishing to have their child(ren) baptized. Parents must be registered parishioners. Sessions are held periodically at parishes throughout the Deanery. It is always preferred that baptisms be celebrated during a regular Sunday Liturgy. Call the Parish office for more information.

Eucharist – Children preparing for Eucharist (Gr. 3) and who are active in the Faith Formation process (including Catholic School children) are eligible to enter the sacramental preparation sessions.

Confirmation – High School youth who are entering the 11th grade and who are active in the Faith Formation process or attend a Catholic High School since 9th grade are eligible to enter the Confirmation preparation sessions.

R.C.I.A. – Rite of Christian Initiation for adults are initiated into the Church through this process. Any individual who may be interested in becoming a member of the Catholic Church is invited. Please call the Church office.

SACRAMENTS OF VOCATION

Priesthood/Permanent Deaconate – Men who feel that they may be being called to the vocational life of Priesthood or Deaconate can contact the pastor at any time or call the Diocesan Vocation Office at 814-824-1111.

Matrimony – There is a required preparation process which normally includes 3 sessions with the pastor and an Engagement Encounter or Nova experience. Please notify the pastor at least 6 months prior to the anticipated date of marriage.

SACRAMENTS OF HEALING

Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick-Celebrated for all who are seriously ill annually at a parish Liturgy. The Sacrament is also available upon request.

Reconciliation – The sacrament is celebrated weekly on Saturday from 4:45 – 5:15 p.m, or anytime by request. Parish Penance services are celebrated during Advent and Lent. Children preparing for Reconciliation (Gr. 2) and who are active in the Faith Formation process (including Catholic School children) are eligible to enter the sacramental preparation sessions.
