Christ's Birth is the Answer What's the Question?

My friends, as we take a few moments to ponder the meaning of Christ's Birth for you and us personally during this Christmas Season, let us reflect on what Isaiah the Prophet wrote, centuries before Christ, about the Messiah King to come, and that He would be the fulfillment of a long awaited promise from God and the ANSWER for peace in the world.

In the midst at times, when Israel was sinful and unfaithful to God, and other times when they were weak people, frightened of their own shadow, so to speak, their questions were: "Will the Lord reject forever and nevermore be favorable? Will His Kindness utterly cease, His Promises fail for all generations? Has God forgotten pity? (Psalm 77: 8-10a) These were Israels QUESTIONS.

Isaiah's following words bring a consoling **answer** to these doubts and trials God's people endured: "In the days to come, the mountain of the Lord's House shall be established as the highest mountain and raised above the hills. All nations shall stream toward it; many people shall come and say: "Come, let us climb the Lord's Mountain, to the house of the God of Jacob, that He may instruct us in His Ways and we may walk in His Paths. For from Zion shall go forth instruction and the Word of the Lord from Jerusalem. He shall judge between the nations and impose terms on many peoples. They shall beat their swords into plow shares and their spears into pruning hooks. One nation shall not raise the sword against another, nor shall they train for war again. O House of Jacob come, let us walk in the light of the Lord!" (Isaiah 2: 2-5)

Isaiah goes on to say that the Messiah comes to bring peace and healing to people personally: "say to those whose hearts are frightened, be strong, fear not! Here is your God. He comes with vindication; with divine recompense He comes to save you. Then will the eyes of the blind be opened, the ears of the deaf be cleared. Then will the lame leap like a stag, then the tongue of the dumb will sing. Streams will burst forth in the desert, and rivers in the steppe. The burning sands will become pools and the thirsty ground springs of water." (Isaiah 35: 4-7)

My friends, reflecting on these Scripture passages, we may first ask the question: how will the meaning of Christ's Birth bring peace in the midst of an angry, fighting, sinful world? The answer is to pray each day for peace. The question for each of us personally can be: will Christ's Birth 2000 years ago have a significant impact and change in my life here and now? The answer is YES-Christ's Birth will have a profound positive impact on your life here and now by praying for the **grace** to believe that hearts full of fear, hopelessness, or insecurity would be made strong. Choose to pray for the grace that Jesus' rebirth in our lives can bring physical and spiritual healing to all of us where we need it the most.

As we celebrate the birthday of our Messiah and Lord, Jesus Christ, let's CHOOSE to activate our prayers most fervently, believing that Christ's rebirth in our lives will make all the difference to us and will bring LASTING JOY!

SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION

Baptism – A baptism preparation session is required of all parents wishing to have their child(ren) baptized. Parents must be registered parishioners. Sessions are held periodically at parishes throughout the Deanery. It is always preferred that baptisms be celebrated during a regular Sunday Liturgy. Call the Parish office for more information.

Eucharist – Children preparing for Eucharist (Gr. 3) and who are active in the Faith Formation process (including Catholic School children) are eligible to enter the sacramental preparation sessions.

Confirmation – High School youth who are entering the 9th grade and who are active in the Faith Formation process or attend a Catholic High School are eligible to enter the Confirmation preparation sessions.

R.C.I.A. – Rite of Christian Initiation for adults are initiated into the Church through this process. Any individual who may be interested in becoming a member of the Catholic Church is invited. Please call the Church office.

SACRAMENTS OF VOCATION

Priesthood/Permanent Deaconate – Men who feel that they may be being called to the vocational life of Priesthood or Deaconate can contact the pastor at any time or call the Diocesan Vocation Office at 814-824-1111.

Matrimony – There is a required preparation process which normally includes 3 sessions with the pastor and an Engagement Encounter or Nova experience. Please notify the pastor at least 6 months prior to the anticipated date of marriage.

SACRAMENTS OF HEALING

Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick-Celebrated for all who are seriously ill. The Sacrament is also available upon request.

Reconciliation – Children preparing for Reconciliation (Gr. 2) and who are active in the Faith Formation process (including Catholic School children) are eligible to enter the sacramental preparation sessions.
